

GERT 523/GERT 478
Designing Programs for People with Dementia
(2 Credits)

This course is designed for professionals who want to learn more about needs-based assessment and successful programming in dementia care. Essential considerations when designing meaningful group experiences for persons with a variety of physical, emotional, and behavioral issues related to progressive dementia will be explored. The highlight of GERT 523/478 is a fieldwork project that provides students with the opportunity to design, implement, and evaluate a small group program for persons with moderate to advanced dementia in their setting of choice.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES – Students will learn how to...

- Describe the rationale for providing meaningful programs that address the cognitive, physical, spiritual and psychosocial needs of persons with dementia throughout the continuum of the condition.
- Assess the ongoing needs of persons with dementia and determine how this information can be used in daily care.
- Customize approaches for assisting individuals with diverse levels of functioning to be more independent.
- Design and facilitate a successful small group experience for individuals with moderate to advanced stage dementia, with an emphasis on building meaningful relationships among the group members.
