# Archaeology Field School

The **2008 EMU Archaeology Field School** provides students with the opportunity to earn course credits and hands-on experience in archaeological field and lab research. Each morning, students meet at the archaeology lab and go to the project area at nearby **Lower Huron and Oakwoods Metroparks**. During the day, students learn survey methods to identify prehistoric and historic sites and excavation techniques to address questions on how old sites are, what cultures used the sites, and what activities took place at the sites. At the end of some days, students work with the artifacts in the archaeology lab. The field school results contribute to our understanding of the culture history of the Huron River Valley. The field school also provides a public service to the Huron-Clinton Metroparks.

**Two-Week Program** 26 May - 6 June 2008  
ANTH361 Archaeological Fieldwork (5 cred.)

**One-Week Program** 19-23 May 2008  
ANTH261 Introductory Archaeological Fieldwork (3 cred.)
