**Washtenaw Community College – Associate in Arts in Human Services
Eastern Michigan University – Bachelor of Science in Social Work**

Purpose:

Bring a copy of this articulation agreement to all advising sessions.

This articulation agreement is designed to provide a smooth curriculum transition for students who complete the Human Services Program at WCC and transfer to EMU to earn a Bachelor of Science in Social Work. The agreement is designed to minimize loss of credits and duplication of coursework.

Requirements:

1. Complete the Human Services program at Washtenaw Community College and the coordinated program of study for the Bachelor of Science in Social Work at Eastern Michigan University, as described in the attached articulation guide.
2. Students whose transcripts are endorsed as “MACRAO Satisfied” by the community college will be required to meet EMU’s additional four general education requirements, indicated on the articulation guide with a “1”, and listed below:
 - a) a course in advanced written composition, speech, or a foreign language [ENG 226 at WCC]
 - b) A course in mathematical reasoning [MTH 160 at WCC]
 - c) A course in computer literacy [CIS 100 at WCC]
 - d) A cross-cultural course [ART 143, 150; ENG 181 or 214 at WCC]

To use MACRAO, students should request a MACRAO evaluation of their transcript in the Community College Student Records or Registrar’s Office. Students who do not satisfy MACRAO will have to complete all of EMU’s general education requirements.

3. Only courses with a grade of “C” or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to EMU. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for admission to EMU.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require only that a minimum of 49 credit hours must be taken at the four-year college level, 15 hours of which must be in major/program requirements at the 300/400 level. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
5. Students must meet course and grade point average requirements at the time of application to the Social Work program. For exact requirements, request an application from the Admissions Office, 401 Pierce Hall. WCC graduates will receive equal consideration with others seeking admission or financial aid. Program requirements in effect at the time of admission to the program must be followed.
6. Eligibility for placement in the required two semesters of senior-year field placement includes:
 - a.) a cumulative GPA of 2.3 in all EMU courses (must be maintained through field placement),
 - b.) a minimum grade of “C” in each required SWRK course, completion of all required social work courses through the 300 level (including the courses that fulfill Life Span Human Growth & Development and Abnormal Psychology),
 - c.) complete a minimum of 40 hours (post high school) volunteer work, internship, or work-experience at a social welfare agency or organization that is documented by a reference letter from the supervisor of that experience.
 - d.) complete a written essay on the student’s interest in social work as a career
7. Application to the Social Work program is made while enrolled in SWRK 251. SWRK 251 and SWRK 222 are pre-requisite for all upper division SWRK courses and must be completed before starting the professional sequence at EMU.
8. Students should meet with the EMU Social Work Program Coordinator early, before completing an application to EMU. A copy of the articulation guide should be included in the application and taken to all advising sessions.

Effective Dates: March 15, 2005 until March 15, 2008. If this agreement is not renewed, students who began this program before its termination will have three additional years, beyond the initial three years, to be admitted to EMU under the terms of the agreement. Students should check with an advisor each semester to find out if there are changes to the curriculum at either school. Students who began the MCCC program prior to the effective date, may use the agreement, to the extent that the requirements completed are consistent with this agreement.
