Purpose: Bring a copy of this articulation agreement to all advising sessions.

This articulation agreement was developed to provide a smooth curriculum transition for students who want to complete the Criminal Justice program at WCC and transfer to EMU to earn a Bachelor of Arts or Science in Criminology and Criminal Justice. The agreement is designed to minimize loss of credits and duplication of coursework in transferring.

Requirements:

1. Complete the coordinated program of study for the Criminal Justice program at WCC and Criminology and Criminal Justice program at EMU as indicated on the following pages of this guide. Course substitutions should be made with the guidance of an advisor or counselor to assure that all requirements are met. To earn a B.A. degree, students must include one year of college credit in a foreign language in their program of study.
2. Students whose transcripts are endorsed as “MACRAO Satisfied” by the community college will only be required to meet EMU’s additional four general education requirements, indicated on the attached articulation guide with a “1”, and listed below:
 - a) A course in advanced composition, speech, or a foreign language [ENG 226 at WCC]
 - b) A course in mathematical reasoning [SOCL 250 at EMU]
 - c) A cross-cultural course [SOC 205 at WCC] or [SOCL 214 or other approved course at EMU]
 - d) A course in computer literacy [CIS 100, 110, BOS 206, CPS 120 at WCC] or [approved course at EMU]*To use MACRAO, students should request a MACRAO evaluation of their transcript in the Community College Student Records Office. Students who do not satisfy MACRAO will have to complete all of EMU’s general education requirements.*
3. Only courses with a grade of 2.0 or better (on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to EMU. A course completed with a grade of less than 2.0, even if it is counted toward graduation at the community college and used to satisfy MACRAO, will not transfer and will have to be repeated if it is an EMU requirement. If a WCC course has more credits than the EMU equivalent course, the additional credits will be included in the program total as general transfer credit.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require only that a minimum of 30 credit hours must be taken at EMU, 15 hours of which must be in program requirements at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, at least 10 hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
5. Students must meet EMU’s admission requirements at the time of admission, including a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 and submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges.
6. Students should meet with the EMU program coordinator early, before completing an admission application. A copy of the articulation guide should be included in the application to EMU and brought to all advising sessions. Copies of this agreement are available at www.emich.edu/ccr/artguide.htm.

Effective Dates: August 1, 2003. This agreement has been **extended until September 1, 2007**. WCC students, who began this articulated program prior to fall semester 2007, may continue to use this articulation guide and will have at least three years beyond the ending date to be admitted to EMU under the terms of this agreement.
