Major Requirements (30-36 Credits)

Students must complete a major of at least 30 credits. Some majors to consider with Historic Preservation are History, Geography, Art History, Education, or Public Administration. Before completing transfer courses for a major, see the appropriate department head to determine if courses are equivalent.

Additional Requirement (0-3 credits)

Students must complete one Learning Beyond the Classroom experience or course offered by EMU. Co-op's and internships will satisfy this requirement. Consult the Historic Preservation adviser for options.

Additional Information:

1. In completing the coordinated program of study for the Historic Preservation program at NSCC and the Bachelor of Science program at EMU as indicated on the preceding pages, course substitutions should be made with the guidance of the advisers at both institutions to assure that all requirements are satisfied. Courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's Bachelor of Science degree.
2. Students whose transcripts are endorsed as "Ohio Transfer Module Complete" by the community college will only be required to meet EMU's three general education requirements, noted with a "1" on the articulation guide and listed below. These requirements may be completed at the most appropriate time for the student whether before or after admission to EMU.
 - a) an approved course in Quantitative Reasoning: [STA 220 at NSCC] or [MATH 110 at EMU]
 - b) an approved course in Global Awareness or US Diversity: [GEOG 110 at NSCC]
 - c) an approved Learning Beyond the Classroom course or experience offered by EMU.

To use Ohio Transfer Module, students should request a MACRAO evaluation of their transcript from the NSCC Registration and Records Office. Students who do not satisfy Ohio Transfer Module will have to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as listed in the Undergraduate Catalog.
3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to EMU. A course completed with a grade of less than 2.0, even though it is counted toward graduation at the community college and used to satisfy Ohio Transfer Module, will not transfer and will have to be repeated if it is a requirement of the B.S. degree program at EMU.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 30 credit hours must be completed at the four-year college level, of which 30 hours must be in courses offered by EMU, with 15 hours in program requirements, at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, at least 10 hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
5. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for admission to EMU. Students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher at NSCC and have completed at least 56 credits will be given priority admission to the CAS. Students with a community college GPA of less than 3.0 may apply and be conditionally admitted to the College of Arts and Science for the first semester at EMU and will be regularly admitted after successful completion of at least 12 credits at EMU with a minimum overall EMU (GPA) of 2.5.
6. Students are encouraged to contact the College of Arts and Science Undergraduate Adviser early, before completing an admission application to EMU. To facilitate the evaluation of transcript(s), students should include a copy of this articulation guide in their application to EMU and bring a copy to all advising sessions.

Effective Dates: September 1, 2007 until September 1, 2010. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who already began the program at NSCC will have an additional three years to be admitted to EMU under the terms of the agreement. Students who began the program prior to the effective date may use this agreement to the extent that the courses completed are consistent with the agreement.
