Additional Information:

1. In completing the coordinated program of study, as indicated on the preceding guides, substitutions should be made with the guidance of the EMU and OCC advisers to assure that program and graduation requirements will be satisfied at each institution. Each institution will be responsible for determining if the requirements of their own institution are satisfied. Courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's Public Safety Administration program.
2. Students whose transcripts are endorsed as "MACRAO Satisfied" by the community college will be required to meet EMU's three general education requirements, indicated on this guide with a "1", and listed below. These requirements may be completed at the most appropriate time for the student whether before or after admission to EMU.
 - a) an approved course in Quantitative Reasoning: [MATH 1500, 1540, 1580, 1600, or 1730 at OCC] or [MATH 110 at EMU]
 - c) a course in Perspectives on a Diverse World: [SOC 2530 at OCC] or [ANTH 214 at EMU]
 - d) a Learning Beyond the Classroom (LBC) course or experience offered by EMU: [PLSC 488 or other approved LBC course/experience offered by EMU]

To use MACRAO, students should request a MACRAO evaluation of their transcript in the Oakland Community College Registrar's Office. Students who do not satisfy MACRAO will have to complete EMU's general education requirements as listed in the undergraduate catalog..

3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to EMU.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 30 credit hours must be completed in EMU courses, 15 hours of which must be in major/program requirements at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduation, a minimum of 10 hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
5. Students must meet all admission requirements at the time of admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. OCC students will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission and financial aid.
6. Students are encouraged to meet with the EMU Public Safety Administration Adviser early, before completing an admission application to EMU. A copy of the articulation guide should be included with the application to EMU and brought to all advising sessions. Copies of this agreement are available at www.emich.edu/ccr/artguide.htm.

Effective Dates: September 1, 2007 until September 1, 2010.

If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students will have an additional three years to be admitted to EMU under the terms of the agreement. Students who began the program prior to the effective period may use this agreement.
