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**Additional Information:**

1. In completing the coordinated program of study for this articulation agreement, course substitutions should be made with the guidance of the advisors (indicated below) at both institutions to assure that all requirements are satisfied. Courses indicated with an \* are required for EMU's Technology Management Program.
2. Students whose transcripts are endorsed as "MACRAO Satisfied" will only be required to meet EMU's three general education requirements, noted on the articulation guide and listed below:
  - a) an approved course in Quantitative Reasoning: [at GRCC: MA 127 is required for this major.
  - b) An approved course in US Diversity or Global Awareness: [at GRCC: **Social Science:** AN 210, 280; GE 135, 281; GO 262; HS 120, 121, 215, 225, 230, 251, 281, PS 201, 202, 215; SO 260; **Humanities** COM 235, 236; EN 251, 270, 271, 272, 278, 284; HU 281] or [at EMU: refer to the online catalog: <http://www.emich.edu/gened/students/approved.php>]
  - c) an approved Learning Beyond the Classroom course or experience offered by EMU: [TM 387 or see EMU Program Coordinator for other options.]

*To use MACRAO, students must request that an official community college transcript, with the "MACRAO Satisfied" stamp, be sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students, who do not have "MACRAO Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as listed in the Undergraduate Catalog. The MACRAO stamp may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform advisors at EMU that they intend to complete MACRAO, or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program.*

3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to EMU.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 30 credit hours must be completed at EMU, 15 hours of which must be in program requirements at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
5. Students must meet all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. GRCC students will receive equal consideration with other students for course registration and financial aid.
6. Students are encouraged to contact the Technology Management Program Coordinator early, before applying to EMU. To facilitate the evaluation of transcripts, students should enclose a copy of this articulation guide with their EMU admission application and bring a copy to all advising sessions. **Effective Dates: May 1, 2012 until April 30, 2015**

This is a renewal of an agreement made in July 2005 and renewed in September 2008. Students who began this program prior to the new effective date have the option of using this agreement or continuing to follow the agreement they were already using. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who already started the program will be given three additional years to be admitted to EMU under the terms of this agreement.
