Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) Requirements (30-33 credits)	
Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the EMU General Education Application Requirements of one Perspectives on a Diverse World course, one Learning Beyond the Classroom experience, and one writing intensive course in the major. Courses listed below for the MTA also satisfy major requirements at HFC and/or EMU. Students who started before Fall 2014 may continue to follow the MACRAO Agreement until the end of summer 2019. LBC and Writing Intensive Requirements

Students must complete one “Learning beyond the Classroom” (LBC) course or experience at EMU and one “Writing Intensive” course in the major. Consult College of Business advisor for options to complete these requirements.

Students following this agreement have the option of selecting any of the following disciplines to complete the BBA: accounting, computer information systems, economics, entrepreneurship, general business, marketing, management, finance, and supply chain management. A sample course sequence for Supply Chain Management is listed below. Sequences for other business majors are available.

Sample Sequence for completing the Supply Chain Management Major

Courses may not be offered every semester. Schedule an appointment with a COB advisor to develop a plan of study.

DS 265 and any other foundation courses, not already completed, must be completed in the first semester at EMU. Math course must be completed before taking DS 265.

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Additional Information:

1. In completing the coordinated program of study for this articulation agreement, course substitutions should be made with the guidance of the advisors (indicated below) at both institutions to assure that all requirements are satisfied. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. HFC courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's Bachelor of Business Administration Program.
2. Students whose transcripts have the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will only be required to complete the General Education Application requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" (LBC) area, and a writing intensive course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World course may be transferred from the community college.

Students must request that an official community college transcript, with "MTA Satisfied", be sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students, who do not have this on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as listed in the Undergraduate Catalog. MTA requirements may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform advisors at EMU that they intend to complete the MTA or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program.

3. Only courses with a grade of 2.0 or better on a 4.0 scale will be accepted for transfer to EMU.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 42 credit hours must be completed at the four-year college level, of which 30 hours must be in courses offered by EMU, with 15 hours in program requirements, at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, at least 10 hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation. Courses listed in this guide may be completed at the most opportune time for students, whether before or after admission to EMU, as long as appropriate pre-requisites are satisfied
5. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for admission to EMU. Students with a community college GPA of 3.0 or higher, who have completed the pre-admission business foundation courses, with the exception of DS 265, will receive direct admission to the College of Business. DS 265 must be completed in the first two semesters of enrollment at EMU. Students whose community college GPA's are less than 3.0 may apply and be conditionally admitted to the College of Business for the first semester at EMU and will be regularly admitted after successful completion of at least 12 credits at EMU with a minimum overall EMU (GPA) of 2.5.
6. Students are encouraged to contact the College of Business Undergraduate Advising Office before applying for admission to EMU. To facilitate the evaluation of transcripts, indicate you are using this articulation guide on the EMU Community College Relations website <http://www.emich.edu/ccr/trackingssystem/Enter.php>, and bring a copy of this guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Dates: January 1, 2015 through January 1, 2018. This is a renewal of an agreement made February 2005 and renewed in 2007. Students who began this program prior to the new effective date have the option of changing to this guide. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who already started the program will be given an additional three years to be admitted to EMU under the terms of this agreement.
