Discipline Requirements (24-30 credits)

Students may complete a major in any of the following areas: accounting(24), computer information systems(30), economics(24), entrepreneurship(24), general business(24), marketing(24), management or management with human resource mgmt concentration(24), finance(24), supply chain management(27)

Additional Requirement

Students must complete one Learning Beyond the Classroom experience or course offered by EMU. Consult the College of Business advisor for options.

University Electives (0-1 credits)

The number of elective credits needed varies according to the major chosen. Students who choose a discipline with only 24 credits may need additional credits to satisfy the minimum requirement of 40 credits at the four-year level.

Note: Each student must complete a writing intensive course as part of the major. Consult your advisor for course options.

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The total credit hours will vary depending on the major selected and the specific courses completed. Students who transfer less than 84 credits from Monroe County Community College will have to complete additional credits at EMU to satisfy the minimum of 124 credits for graduation.

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Additional Information:

1. In completing the coordinated program of study for the Accounting program at MCCC and the Bachelor of Business Administration program at EMU as indicated on the preceding pages, course substitutions may be made with the guidance of the advisors at both institutions to assure that all requirements are satisfied. Courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's Bachelor of Business Administration degree. Other courses will transfer as electives or general transfer credit, but are not required for EMU's program.
2. Students whose transcripts are endorsed as "MACRAO Satisfied" will only be required to meet three of EMU's general education requirements, noted on the articulation guide and listed below. These may be completed at the most convenient time for the student, whether before or after admission to EMU.
 - a) an approved course in Quantitative Reasoning: [MATH 154 at MCCC or [MATH 110 at EMU]
 - b) an approved course in Global Awareness or US Diversity: [ENGL 240 or 255 at MCCC]
 - c) an approved Learning Beyond the Classroom course or experience offered by EMU.

To use MACRAO, students should request a MACRAO evaluation of their transcript from the MCCC Registration and Records Office. Students who do not satisfy MACRAO will have to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as listed in the Undergraduate Catalog.
3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to EMU.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 40 credit hours must be completed at the four-year college level, of which 30 hours must be in courses offered by EMU, with 15 hours in program requirements, at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, at least 10 hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
5. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for admission to EMU. Students with a community college GPA of 3.0 or higher will receive priority admission to the College of Business without a probationary semester. Students whose community college GPA's are less than 3.0 may apply and be conditionally admitted to the College of Business for the first semester at EMU and will be regularly admitted after successful completion of at least 12 credits at EMU with a minimum overall EMU (GPA) of 2.5.
6. Students are encouraged to contact the College of Business Undergraduate Advisor early, before completing an admission application to EMU. To facilitate the evaluation of transcript(s), students should indicate they are using this articulation guide on their application to EMU and bring a copy to all advising sessions.

Effective Dates: September 1, 2009 through August 31, 2012. This replaces an agreement made on September 1, 2006 and all subsequent updates. Students, who began the program at MCCC prior to the effective date, may continue to follow the articulation guide in place when they started or may change to this articulation guide. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who already started the program will have an additional three years to be admitted to EMU under the terms of this agreement.
