Additional Requirement

Students must complete one Learning Beyond the Classroom experience or course offered by EMU. Consult College of Business advisor for options.

University Electives (0-3 credits)

The number of elective credits needed varies according to the EMU major chosen and the number of credits transferred from Mott. Students should choose a discipline to major in before completing an elective. Choosing electives wisely will increase your employment opportunities in a competitive job market. The College of Business advisor will assist you in determining if you need any electives and in choosing electives that will most enhance your marketability.

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Additional Information:

1. In completing the coordinated program of study for the Accounting Information Systems, Management, or General Business programs at Mott and the Bachelor of Business Administration program at EMU as indicated on the preceding pages, course substitutions should be made with the guidance of the program advisors at both institutions to assure that all requirements are met. Courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's Bachelor of Business Administration Program.
2. Students whose transcripts are endorsed as "MACRAO Satisfied" will only be required to meet EMU's additional three general education requirements, noted on the articulation guide and listed below. These requirements may be completed at the most appropriate time for the student whether before or after admission to EMU.
 - a) An approved course in Quantitative Reasoning: [MATH 130, 150, 165, or 170 at Mott] or MATH 110 at EMU]
 - b) One approved course in US Diversity or Global Awareness: [ART 116, ENGL 220, 223, 228, 235, FILM 251, MUS 183, PHIL 251 at Mott]
 - c) One Learning beyond the Classroom course or experience offered by EMU [Consult COB Advisor for options at EMU]

To use MACRAO, students must request a MACRAO evaluation of their transcript from the Mott Registrar's Office. Students who do not satisfy MACRAO will have to complete all of EMU's general education requirements as listed in the undergraduate catalog.

3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to EMU.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 42 credit hours must be completed at the four-year college level, of which 30 hours must be in courses offered by EMU, with 15 hours in program requirements, at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, at least 10 hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation
5. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required for admission to EMU. Students with a community college GPA of 3.0 or higher and who have completed at least 56 credits will be admitted to the College of Business without a probationary semester. A student whose community college GPA is less than 3.0 may apply and be conditionally admitted to the College of Business for the first semester at EMU and will be regularly admitted after successful completion of at least 12 credits at EMU with a minimum overall EMU (GPA) of 2.5.
6. Students should contact the College of Business Undergraduate Advising Office early, before completing an admission application to EMU. To facilitate the evaluation of transcripts, students should bring a copy of the articulation guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Dates: September 1, 2009 until August 31, 2012. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who already started the program will be given three additional years to be admitted to EMU under the terms of this agreement. Students who enrolled at Mott prior to the effective period may use this agreement.
