Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) Requirements (30 credits)																																									
<p>Students with an MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one Perspectives on a Diverse World course, one Learning Beyond the Classroom experience, and a writing intensive course in the major. <u>Courses listed below for the MTA also satisfy major requirements at OCC and/or EMU.</u> Students who started college before fall 2014 may continue to follow the MACRAO Agreement until the end of summer 2019. *The minimum credits required to graduate is 124 but the total will vary depending on the business discipline completed at EMU and the program completed at OCC. If enough credits are not transferred, additional credits will need to be completed at EMU to satisfy the minimum required for graduation.

Note: Choosing electives wisely will increase your employment opportunities in a competitive job market. The College of Business Advisor will assist you in choosing a minor, or selecting courses in an area such as: foreign languages, manufacturing, apparel merchandising, health administration, hotel and restaurant management, political science/public administration, construction management, graphic design, global information systems, professional writing, public relations, internships or cooperative education.

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Additional Information:

1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. For the purpose of this articulation agreement, both institutions agree to accept transferrable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions. OCC courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's BBA degree. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one Perspectives on a Diverse World course, one Learning Beyond the Classroom experience, and a Writing Intensive course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be satisfied at the community college as part of the MTA requirements.
To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as listed in the Undergraduate Catalog. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program. Students who enrolled in college prior to September 2014 have until the end of summer semester 2019 to complete the MACRAO agreement. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at EMU after summer semester 2019.
3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to either institution.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 42 credit hours must be completed at the four-year college level, with at least 30 credit hours officered by EMU, of which 15 hours of which must be in major/program requirements at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduation, a minimum of 10 hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
5. A minimum cumulative GPA of a 2.0 is required for admission to EMU. Students with a community college GPA of a "2.5" or higher, who have completed the pre-admission business foundation courses, will receive conditional admission to the College of Business. Any foundation courses not already completed must be completed in the first semester of enrollment at EMU. Students will be regularly admitted after successful completion of at least 12 credits at EMU with a minimum overall EMU (GPA) of "2.5".
6. Students are encouraged to contact the College of Business Undergraduate Advising Office before applying to EMU. To facilitate advising and the evaluation of transcripts, sign up for this articulation agreement using this link www.emich.edu/ccr/trackingssystem/Enter.php, and bring a copy of this articulation guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Dates: January 1, 2017 until January 1, 2020.

This is a renewal of an agreement made in August 2004 and renewed in September 2007, and September 2013. An Extension was made in 2011. Students who began this program prior to the new effective date have the option of changing to this guide or may follow the guide they started under for up to seven years. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who already began the program at OCC will have an additional three years to be admitted to EMU under the terms of the agreement.
