Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) Requirements (30 credits)

Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one Perspectives on a Diverse World course, one Learning beyond the Classroom experience, and a writing intensive course in the major. Courses listed below for the MTA also satisfy program requirements at EMU and/or SC. For SC approved MTA courses go to Schoolcraft's website. Students without an MTA or MACRAO endorsement must complete EMU's general education program.

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Completion of EMU's BBA Program

Discipline Requirements (24-33 credits)

Students may complete discipline requirements in any of the following areas: accounting, accounting information systems, computer information systems, economics, entrepreneurship, general business, marketing, management, finance, supply chain management

Note: Each student must complete a writing intensive course as part of the major. Consult an advisor for course options.

LBC Requirement

One Learning Beyond the Classroom (LBC) course or noncredit experience must be completed at EMU. Consult College of Business advisor for options.

Combined Degree Opportunities: Accounting offers a 150 credit hour Combined BBA+MS in Accounting and Taxation; Accounting Information Systems offers a 150 credit hour Combined BBA+MS in Accounting Information Systems and Accounting. More information can be found in EMU's catalog.

General Credits (0-18 credits)

Complete enough additional electives to bring the minimum credits at EMU to 42 credits and the total credits for the program to 120 credits.

Sample Sequence for completing the program:

Students following this agreement have the option of selecting any of the following disciplines to complete the BBA: accounting, computer information systems, economics, entrepreneurship, general business, marketing, management, finance, or supply chain management. The sequence below is a sample and will vary by discipline and pace of course completion. Students should see an advisor before enrolling for courses.

If enough credits are not transferred, additional credits will need to be completed at EMU to satisfy the minimum required for graduation.

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both institutions agree to accept transferrable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions. SC courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's BBA in any Business Major. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
- 2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" experience, and a "Writing Intensive" course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.

 To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as applied to transfer students. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general

education program. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at EMU after

- 3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to either institution.
- 4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 42 credit hours must be completed in EMU courses, with at least 15 hours in the program at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 120 credit hours (Fall 2022), completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, are required for graduation.
- 5. Students must satisfy all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. SC students will receive equal consideration with other students for course registration and financial aid.
- 6. To be admitted to the COB, students must have completed all 12 pre-admission courses and have an EMU gpa of a 2.5 or higher. Students that have completed all of the pre-admission business foundation courses except DS 265 or DS 251 will need to successfully complete DS 265 or DS 251 in his/her first semester at EMU. Students missing pre-admission business foundation courses beyond DS 265 or DS 251 should consult with an EMU advisor to plan how to complete those courses.
- 7. Students are encouraged to contact EMU's Undergraduate Admissions before applying to EMU. To facilitate advising and the evaluation of transcripts, and bring a copy of this articulation guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Date: September 1, 2020 until August 31, 2023.

This is a renewal of an agreement made in February 2005 and renewed in September 2008, September 2010 (extended in September 2013), and September 2017. This agreement is consistent with the 2020-2021 catalog. Students have until summer 2028 to graduate from Eastern Michigan University following this agreement. In the event that a student does not complete the program within seven years, they may be required to have their credits reevaluated using the requirements of the current articulation guide.
