Discipline Requirements (24-33 credits)

Students may complete a major in any of the following areas: accounting, accounting information systems, computer information systems, economics, entrepreneurship, general business, marketing, management, finance, and supply chain management.

Note: Each student must complete a writing intensive course as part of the major. Consult your advisor for course options.

LBC Requirement (0-3 credits)

One Learning beyond the Classroom (LBC) course or noncredit experience must be completed at EMU. Consult College of Business advisor for options.

University Electives (0-18 credits)

A minimum of 42 credits must be completed at EMU. Additional credits may be required depending on the discipline chosen or the amount of credits remaining to meet the minimum graduation requirements of 124.

Sample Sequence for completing the program:

Students following this agreement have the option of selecting any of the following disciplines to complete the BBA: accounting, accounting information systems, computer information systems, economics, entrepreneurship, general business, marketing, management, finance, or supply chain management. The sequence below is a sample and will vary by discipline and pace of course completion. Students should see an advisor before enrolling for courses.

DS 265 or DS 251 must be completed in the first semester at FMI.

NOTE: The number of elective credits needed in this agreement varies according to the major/discipline chosen. Students should choose a major/discipline before completing open electives. Choosing electives wisely will increase your employment opportunities in a competitive job market. The College of Business advisor will assist you in determining if you need electives and if so, in choosing electives that will most enhance your marketability.

^{*}The minimum credits required to graduate is 124 but the total will vary depending on the business discipline completed at EMU and the program completed at MCC. If enough credits are not transferred, additional credits will need to be completed at EMU to satisfy the minimum required for graduation.

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Additional Information:

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both institutions agree to accept transferrable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions. MCC courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's BBA. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
- 2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" experience, and a "Writing Intensive" course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.
 - To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as applied to transfer students. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at EMU after August 2019.
- 3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to either institution.
- 4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 42 credit hours must be completed in EMU courses, with at least 15 hours in the program at the 300-level or above. The business disciplines all require a minimum of 21 credit hours that must be taken at the 300 level or higher. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
- 5. To be admitted to the COB, students must have completed all 12 pre-admission courses and have an EMU gpa of a 2.5 or higher. Students that have completed all of the pre-admission business foundation courses except DS 265 or DS 251 will need to successfully complete DS 265 or DS 251 in his/her first semester at EMU. Students missing pre-admission business foundation courses beyond DS 265 or DS 251 should consult with an EMU advisor to plan how to complete those courses.
- 6. Students are encouraged to contact the College of Business Undergraduate Advising Office before applying to EMU. Copies of this agreement are available at www.emich.edu/ccr/artguide.php. To facilitate advising and the evaluation of transcripts, sign up for this articulation agreement and bring a copy of the articulation guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Date: September 1, 2019 until August 31, 2022.

This is a renewal of an agreement made in September 2009 and renewed in January 2013. This agreement is consistent with the 2019-2020 catalog. Students have until Summer 2027 to graduate from Eastern Michigan University following this agreement. In the event that a student does not complete the program within seven years, they may be required to have their credits reevaluated using the requirements of the current articulation guide.
