Academy or Internship / Co-op Experience (3-6 credits)

Pre-service students must complete an internship or cooperative education placement or an accredited academy program; in-service students may substitute credits from an accredited academy program, or upon submission of an academy certificate may take three credits of related electives with advisor approval.

Restricted Electives (3 credits)

21 credits from the approved catalog list are required for the program. If courses on the agreement identified to fulfill restricted electives, students must complete the courses at EMU and work with their faculty advisor to determine how students can complete their restricted electives. A minimum of 3 credits must be taken at EMU, or must be substituted by a faculty advisor. See the catalog for course options that fulfill this requirement.

LBC Requirement

Students must complete one Learning Beyond the Classroom course or noncredit experience offered by EMU. Consult your advisor for options.

General Transfer Credit (3-6 credits)

Students must complete a minimum of 30 credits at EMU. Students must complete coursework required for the degree at EMU rather than transfer it in, or may take credit that will apply toward the 30 credit minimum requirement. See an advisor for assistance on choosing courses.

Sample Sequence for completing the program:

Courses are not offered every semester; consult the program advisor to develop a program of study.

The following prerequisite courses must be transferred or completed at EMU before beginning the sequence:

6 credits of PLSC courses below 300 level is a prerequisite for the administrative group courses (satisfied by SC4 PS 101 and 220).

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Additional Information:

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both institutions agree to accept transferable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions. SC4 courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's BS in Public Safety Administration. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
- 2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" experience, and a "Writing Intensive" course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.
 - To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as applied to transfer students. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at EMU after August 2019.
- 3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to either institution.
- 4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 30 credit hours must be completed in EMU courses, with at least 15 hours in the program at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 120 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
- 5. Students must satisfy all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. SC4 students will receive equal consideration with other students for course registration and financial aid.
- 6. Students are encouraged to contact the Francine Parker Advising Center before applying to EMU. To facilitate advising and the evaluation of transcripts, <u>sign up for this articulation agreement</u> and bring a copy of this articulation guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Date: September 1, 2022 until August 31, 2025.

This is a renewal of an agreement made in September 2012 and renewed in September 2016. This agreement is consistent with the 2022-2023 catalog. Students have until summer 2030 to graduate from Eastern Michigan University following this agreement. In the event that a student does not complete the program within seven years, they may be required to have their credits reevaluated using the requirements of the current articulation guide.
