Sample Sequence for completing the program:

Students following this agreement have the option of selecting any of the following disciplines to complete the BBA: accounting, computer information systems, economics, entrepreneurship, general business, marketing, management, finance, or supply chain management. The sequence below is a sample and will vary by discipline and pace of course completion. Students should see an advisor before enrolling for courses.

If enough credits are not transferred, additional credits will need to be completed at EMU to satisfy the minimum required for graduation.

Additional Information:

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both institutions agree to accept transferable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions. WCCCD courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's BBA in Any Business Major. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
- 2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" experience, and a "Writing Intensive" course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.
 - To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as applied to transfer students. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at EMU after August 2019.
- 3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to either institution.
- 4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 42 credit hours must be completed in EMU courses, with at least 15 hours in the program at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 120 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
- 5. Students must satisfy all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. WCCCD students will receive equal consideration with other students for course registration and financial aid.
- 6. To be admitted to the COB, students must have completed all 12 pre-admission courses and have an EMU gpa of a 2.5 or higher. Students that have completed all of the pre-admission business foundation courses except DS 265 or DS 251 will need to successfully complete DS 265 or DS 251 in his/her first semester at EMU. Students missing pre-admission business foundation courses beyond DS 265 or DS 251 should consult with an EMU advisor to plan how to complete those courses.
- 7. Students are encouraged to contact EMU's Admissions Office before applying to EMU. To facilitate advising and the evaluation of transcripts, bring a copy of this articulation guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Date: September 1, 2023 until August 31, 2026.

This is a renewal of an agreement made in September 2007 and renewed in January 2012, and September 2019. This agreement is consistent with the 2023-2024 catalog. Students have until summer 2031 to graduate from Eastern Michigan University following this agreement. In the event that a student does not complete the program within seven years, they may be required to have their credits reevaluated using the requirements of the current articulation guide.
