For Student Affairs and Higher Education Professionals

EMU's Master of Arts in Educational Leadership for Student Affairs and Higher Education Professionals is a proactive response to the challenge of increasing the supply of professionally prepared administrators for post-secondary institutions. It is designed to incorporate a common core of leadership courses and prepare students for the unique challenges of leadership in student affairs and higher education.

The program is designed for individuals who are seeking a practical learning experience rather than a formal concentration in theory and research; provides a quality learning environment with faculty who are engaged in teaching, research, and service; arranges classes that meet in the evenings and weekends; and plans courses in a location that is easily accessible with adequate parking.

Career Opportunities

Graduates of the program will be prepared to enter or continue a career in student affairs and higher education at two-year and four-year institutions. The program is designed to offer students a general introduction to student affairs and higher education as well as provide specific concentration areas for career development. Career opportunities related to student affairs professions are: student activities, residence life, career services, advising, admissions, Greek affairs, multicultural center/advising, and judicial affairs. Career opportunities related to higher education administration are: academic administration, continuing education administration, institutional research, and other various administrative positions. Graduates will also be prepared to pursue advanced study leading to the specialist and doctorate degrees.

Accreditation

Eastern Michigan University is accredited by the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. EMU's College of Education is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. The student affairs emphasis area meets the standards established by Council for the Advancement of Standards in Higher Education (CAS).

The culminating activities include an internship/field experience and a portfolio requirement that must be fulfilled before graduation.

Graduate Assistantships

For those who are interested in attending full-time, there are a number of graduate assistantships offered throughout Eastern Michigan University.

Eastern Michigan University graduate assistantship financial package consists of 18 tuition free credit hours per year (approximately \$3,900) plus a graduate assistantship stipend of approximately \$7,100. Some assistantships provide housing and dining services support. Several departments provide supplemental travel expenses to professional conferences and pay for memberships in the professional organizations appropriate to the student's field of study.

Graduate Assistantship/Program of Study Interview Days – annually held in late March

If you are interested in our programs of study and a graduate assistantship to attend full-time, we offer a specific formal visiting day for prospective graduate students in order to meet students, faculty and student affairs professionals. The purpose of the visiting day is to acquaint you with the campus, the graduate program, and interview for available graduate assistantships.

Advising

An Educational Leadership program adviser will work with you to assist in the exploration of degree requirements, evaluation of applications for admission to a degree program, preparation of a plan of study, approval of program changes, and recommendation for graduation. Admission Requirements

For admission you must:

1. Complete the Graduate School Application. All admission materials, both graduate school and program, are submitted through the Graduate School Office
2. Have earned a valid undergraduate degree from an accredited four-year institution of higher education.
3. International students must have a minimum score of 550 on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or 80 on the Michigan English language Ability Battery (MELAB). International students must also submit a minimum score of 230 on the Test of Spoken English (TSE).
4. Applicants seeking their first master's degree must have a 2.50 undergraduate GPA or a 2.75 GPA in the second half of the undergraduate program. Applicants seeking a second master's degree must have a 3.0 GPA or better on their previous graduate degree.
5. Submit recommendations from two professional supervisors and/or supervising professors that address the quality of the applicant's professional work. Applicants may receive these forms from the department office. Recommendation forms are due with the Graduate School application.
6. Applicants must present evidence of a valid teaching certificate or sign a waiver indicating that they do not seek certification.
7. Applicants must submit a one-page resume detailing their professional and educational experiences.
8. Complete (on the Graduate School application) the personal statement of accomplishments and academic goals portion describing the reasons for requesting admission. This essay must be a minimum of 250 words and will be reviewed as an indicator of writing ability.

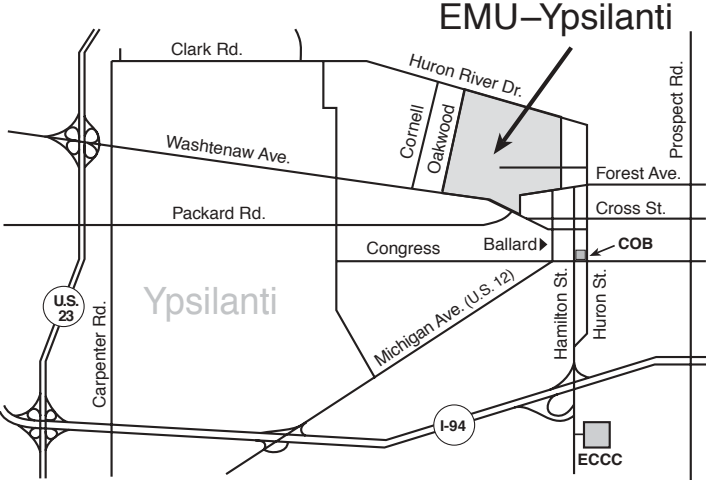
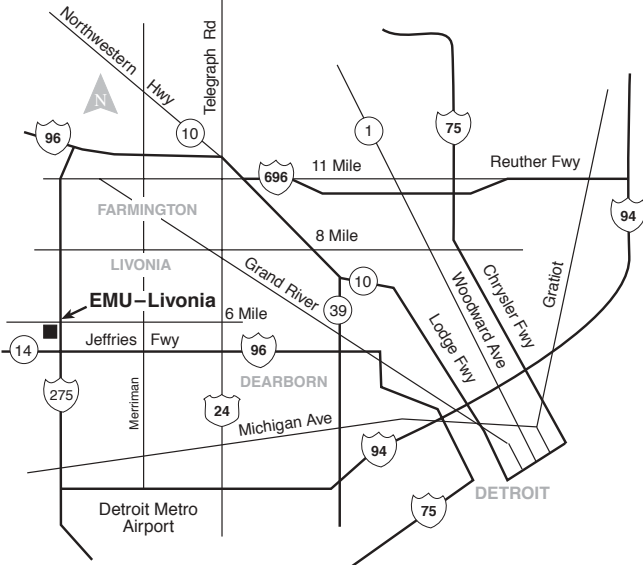

Dear Prospective EDDL Master's or Specialist's Degree Student:

This packet contains the Application for Admission to the Educational Leadership Program at Eastern Michigan University. Please note that the graduate school must have the following documents in order to forward the completed application file to the Educational Leadership Program for action by the admissions committee. The student must submit the following information/documentations to the graduate school:

1. **Graduate Application for Admission**
2. Students must complete the **Personal Statement** of Accomplishments and Academic Goals describing the reason for requesting admission. This essay must be a minimum of 250 words and will be reviewed as an indicator of writing ability.
3. Please attach a one page **Resume** that details work history and educational experience.
4. **Graduate Record Exam** scores must be submitted for **specialist degree students only**. Foreign students must also submit the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL).
5. The student must submit **Transcripts** of past work.
6. The student must submit a valid **Teaching Certificate or Waiver**.
7. The **Confidential Appraisal Forms** are to be given to two professional supervisors and/or supervising professors to indicate the quality of your professional work. **The professional supervisors and/or supervising professors must forward the form directly to the Graduate Admissions Office for inclusion within your completed application file.** Once the forms have been completed please mail them to:
