Dear Friends of EMU Department of Economics,

In Fall 2009, we welcomed a new faculty member, Dr. Mehmet Yaya. Dr. Yaya comes to EMU after completing his Ph.D. at the University of Alabama in August 2009. His areas of teaching include International Trade and Labor Economics. As we gained one faculty member, we lost one faculty member. Dr. Don Pearson retired after 41 years of dedicated service to the department. In recognition of his tenure, EMU's Board of Regents confirmed upon Dr. Pearson the status of Professor Emeritus of Economics, and also chose Dr. Pearson to lead the University Faculty as the Faculty Marshal and carrier of the Mace during Winter Commencement. Also, Dr. Jennifer Rice was promoted to Associate Professor.



The faculty continue to pursue research agendas and publish in highly regarded journals, such as *Applied Economics*, *Journal of Sports Economics*, *International Journal of Pharmaceutical and Healthcare Marketing*, *Social Science Journal*, *Defence and Peace Economics*, and *Review of Black Political Economy*. Dr. Yaya was awarded the New Faculty Provost Award in Fall 2009 and Dr. Rice received the Spring-Summer Faculty Research Fellowship in Spring 2009, and Dr. Thornton received a full year sabbatical for 2010-11.

We are pleased to announce that many of our recent undergraduate and graduate students have received excellent placements upon graduation. Students are currently working for various organizations within Michigan, such as PPA's Education, Workforce, and Economic Development Group, CAR's Labor and Industry Group, Ernst and Young, and Auto Owners Insurance, as well as positions around the United States. Several students are pursuing Ph.D.s in Economics at various top tier universities and students have received internships with Ford Motor Company, Thomson Reuters, and Polk.

The Department has relocated to the third floor, west wing, in King Hall. The move was completed at the end of the Winter semester. We will return to a renovated Pray-Harold in January-June, 2012. All telephone and e-mail contacts are the same as before.

As a final note, I would like to extend my sincere thanks to all the alumni and friends who have provided financial gifts to the Economics department through the EMU Foundation. Such gifts aid in supporting the Department's missions.

FACULTY NEWS:

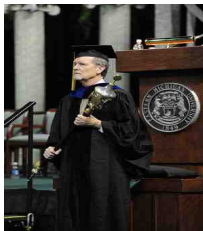


Dr. Jennifer Rice was promoted to Associate Professor in June 2009.



Dr. Mehmet E. Yaya joined the Department of Economics in Fall 2009 after receiving his Ph.D. from the University of Alabama. Dr. Yaya teaches graduate courses in International Trade and Labor Economics and undergraduate courses in Labor Economics and Microeconomics.

Dr. Don Pearson received the status of Emeritus Professor of Economics In December 2009. Dr. Pearson retired at the end of Fall 2009 after 41 years of service in the Department of Economics at Eastern Michigan University. Thank you, Dr. Pearson, for your long-term commitment and dedication to the Department of Economics.



Professor of Emeritus Don Pearson was given the honor to lead his colleagues during the Winter 2010 Commencement. Professor Pearson carried the University mace, a symbol of authority of the President and the Board of Regents. The mace represents the golden flame of learning and is carried by the grand marshal, who is chosen on the basis of service to the university.

Dr. Kemper Moreland and Dr. David Crary were recognized this year for 30 years of service at EMU. Mrs. Rhonda Napier, our senior secretary was recognized for her 15 years of service at EMU.

Dr. James Thornton received a full year sabbatical leave for 2010-2011. He will be spending his leave working on research entitled "Economics of the Wine Industry."

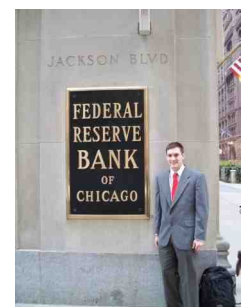
