Students in the BBA program of the College of Business who select Economics as their Major must complete the following College of Business Requirements as well as the requirements for the Economics Major. Students who choose to take DS265 may not take Econ 310 to fulfill the requirement of their major. Instead they must take an additional Economics class of their choice in order to complete the required number of Economics courses. Students who take Econ 310 are excused from the requirement of taking DS265.

The major in economics requires taking TEN classes in Economics. FIVE classes are required in the minor and FIVE are to be chosen by students as electives. It is recommended that students use the five elective courses to complete their knowledge and to help prepare for their career choice or postgraduate education. Consultation with an advisor when making choices on elective courses is essential.

NOTE: The requirement is to take either Econ 310 or Econ 415. Each course has different prerequisites that will determine your ability to take the one of your choice. It is possible to take both courses and have them count toward your 10 course requirement. Econ 310 is not open to students who have taken DS265. Econ 415 is open to students who have taken DS265, but it is not required of students who have taken DS265.

Elective Courses: For students who enroll at EMU beginning with the Fall Semester 2007, one of the five elective courses must be a writing intensive course. Writing intensive courses are identified as such in the online catalog and/or the class schedule. Contact the Economics Department for more information.
