

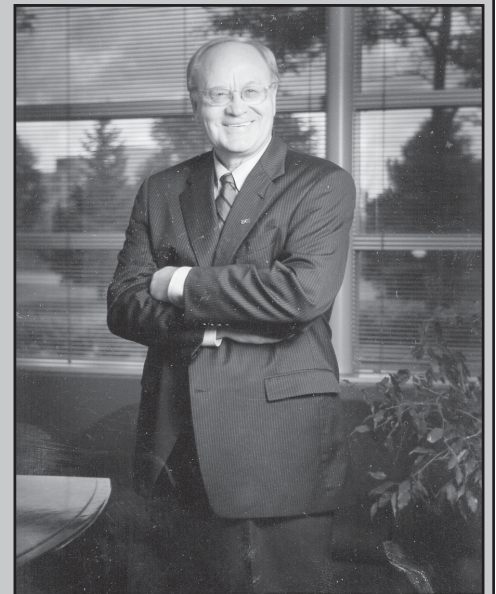
I am pleased to report that for the sixth consecutive year, contributions exceeded \$4 million and totaled \$5,576,981. Fiscal year 2002-03 recorded \$3,169,143 in cash gifts. More than \$1 million was designated for endowed scholarships and endowments. The endowment closed the fiscal year with a market value of \$30.3 million. While the investment market this year has been very challenging, we did experience positive trends toward the end of our fiscal year.

Fund raising in this uncertain financial climate continues to be a challenge for EMU and our peer institutions, indeed, for higher education in general. But we continue to believe that an investment in higher education is one of the best investments one can make for the future of a free and informed society.

Faculty and staff giving helps create opportunities

Donations from EMU faculty and staff throughout the year make a significant difference on our campus and for our students.

Last year, more than \$340,000 was donated to a total of 248 different funds at EMU by faculty, staff and emeritus faculty. The goal for the 17th Annual Program is \$400,000 and organizers hope to build more awareness for year-round giving.

"Our students' success is our success. As the program theme indicates, through our support, we are creating opportunities and ensuring success for our students, ourselves and our community," said Alice Preketes, who is directing this year's program.

To generate excitement, a campus-wide cookie drop is planned for the week of Nov. 10 and brochures outlining the program will be distributed then as well.

tions. Progress reports will be posted on a regular basis as will various gift opportunities.

Unlike other campaigns, 100 percent of donations from faculty and staff goes to the area designated. No administrative fees are deducted.

Last year, several new endowed scholarships were founded in memory or in honor of faculty and staff at EMU (see story, page 2). Donations to any of the following endowments will help enhance these scholarships: the Elwood Kureth Memorial Endowment Scholarship, the Donald Phillips Memorial Endowed Scholarship, the Gail Compton Memorial Endowed Scholarship, the Marylyn Lake Memorial Endowed Scholarship, the Sherry Sayles Endowed Scholarship and the Ronald Collins Memorial Endowed Scholarship.

New endowed scholarships benefit programs, students

Theo Hamilton's friends, celebrating his career and his seventh decade at EMU, established the **Theophilus E. Hamilton Endowed Scholarship**. This scholarship will benefit economically disadvantaged students or returning students seeking a career in education.

The **EMU Latino Alumni Chapter's Endowed Scholarship** will provide funds for tuition, room and board, and books and will benefit Latino students enrolled full-time as graduates or undergraduates with sophomore classification and a minimum 2.75 GPA.

Dr. Jerry Robbins established the **Jerry Robbins Endowed Scholarship** to aid students in the education program who major in mathematics with a minimum 3.0 GPA. He joined EMU in 1991 as dean of the College of Education and professor of educational leadership and continues to dedicate his career to the preparation of outstanding educators.

The **Elwood John C. Kureth Memorial Endowed Scholarship** was established by Dr. Kureth's wife, June, to celebrate his

active role in the community and the University as a role model, teacher, coach and administrator. This scholarship will benefit undergraduate geography and geology students with a 3.0 or higher GPA.

The **Everett Marshall Endowed Scholarship** was established by a friend and respected 1942 EMU alumnus, Wilbert McKeachie, in fond memory of the "Champion of Students" Everett L. Marshall. The scholarship will assist students in the psychology program.

The family of Donald Phillips established the **Dr. Donald B. Phillips Memorial Endowed Scholarship** in honor of his creative and engaging approach to teaching chemistry. This scholarship will benefit students majoring or minoring in an elementary education program that emphasizes science education.

The **Dr. Sherry Loanna Sayles Endowed Scholarship** will benefit economically challenged undergraduate students in the College of Education with a minimum 2.5 GPA. It was founded in Dr. Sayles' memory by her friend and colleague, Dr. Martha W. Tack.

The **Fitch-Meretta Endowed Oboe Scholarship** was created in memory of Dr. William Fitch and enhanced by EMU Professor Kristy Meretta and her family. It will benefit an undergraduate or graduate oboist majoring in music with a minimum 3.0 GPA.

The **Ronald W. Collins Memorial Endowed Scholarship for Undergraduate**

Symposium Student Participants was established through memorial gifts. It will benefit undergraduate symposium participants with a minimum 3.0 GPA.

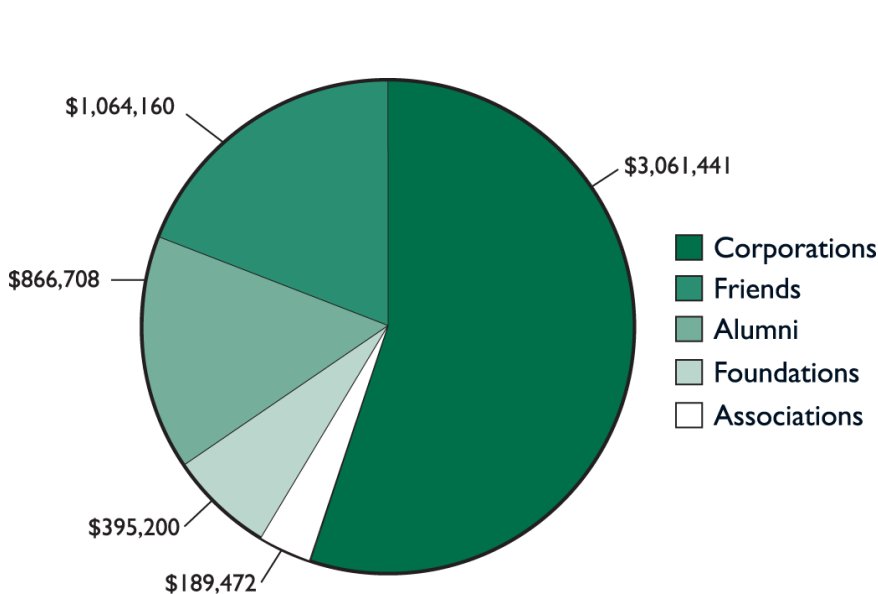
The **Gail W. Compton Endowed Scholarship** was established by friends in the Department of Communication and Theatre Arts in memory of Emeritus Professor Gail W. Compton. It will

benefit communication or theatre arts majors with a minimum 2.5 GPA.

Dr. John W. Porter, emeritus president of EMU, established the **John W. Porter COE Endowed Scholarship**. His scholarship will benefit full-time African American students with a minimum 3.2 GPA enrolled in the College of Education's initial teacher preparation program.

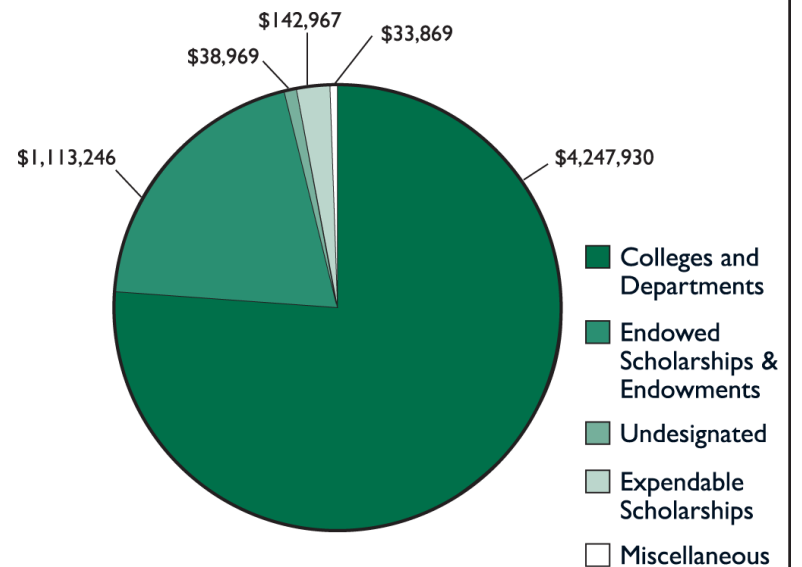
GIVING TO EMU

CORPORATE GIFTS: Corporate support continued to provide the largest number of gifts at 54.9 percent in 2002-03. Friends of EMU also provided significant support with 19.1 percent of gifts.

SUPPORT TO COLLEGES AND DEPARTMENTS: EMU's colleges and departments again received the largest percentage of private support. More than \$4 million, or 76.2 percent of all fund raising, went to this area. Gifts-in-kind are included in this category. The next largest category, at 20 percent, was gifts to endowed scholarships and other endowments. Expendable (current use) scholarships accounted for 2.6 percent.

Personal, corporate gifts create opportunities, enhance learning

Personal and corporate gifts in fiscal year 2002-03 helped create many opportunities and enhanced learning at Eastern Michigan University.

A **\$250,000 grant** from an anonymous donor will enhance EMU's John W. Porter Distinguished Chair in Urban Education. The grant will endow funds for a graduate fellow specifically assigned to support the activities of the Porter chair holder.

A significant gift of software valued at \$750,000 from **SAP America, Inc.**, will help prepare EMU College of Business students for careers utilizing enterprise resource planning (ERP). The software is installed in the Ford Motor Company Learning Center, renovated by gifts from the **Ford Motor Company Fund**.

A generous gift from the estates of Pauline Reiter and her sister, Julianna Kube, will significantly increase funding for the **Reiter-Kube Endowed Scholarship**.

Jeanne and Ernest Merlanti continued their generous support of business ethics at EMU, which will help the College of Business create a business ethics program and an honors seminar.

The **Community Foundation for the National Capital** donated \$70,000 to the Presidential Honors Scholarship program. The gift is part of a three-year pledge to enhance scholarships for students with academic merit.

The **MASCO Corporation Foundation** gifted \$50,000, part of a three-year pledge, to EMU's newly opened University House. The **Christman Company** also continued a tradition of giving with a \$25,000 gift to the University House in 2002-03.

EMU's Walk for Women's Athletics raised more than \$31,000 and attracted 340 walkers and several major community sponsors.

Hammell Music, Inc., donated a gift-in-kind of a new piano to EMU's Music

Department, continuing a valuable partnership between the company and EMU.

Bran+Luebbe, a leader in near infrared analytical instruments for agricultural, food and related products, donated infrared spectrophotometer equipment and software for research in the Department of Human, Environmental and Consumer Resources.

In its third year, the **Pfizer Undergraduate Research Award** program again received generous support from Pfizer, Inc. The program funds internships to train, teach and mentor minority students pursuing careers in the chemical sciences.

The National Council of Teachers of English donated \$27,000 to EMU's English Language and Literature Department.

Alumni from EMU's Construction Management Program have given generously through an annual golf outing, named in honor of Emeritus Professor John A. Weeks.

Comcast, a valued corporate partner, again donated to the scholarship fund and helped enhance the student living environment. **Barnes & Noble**, another corporate partner, also donates to the general scholarship fund each year.

In 2002, Eastern Michigan University was recognized by the **NCAA** and **USA Today** as having the greatest increase in percentage of student-athletes graduating over the previous year among all Division I-A institutions in the United States. The \$25,000 cash award that accompanied the recognition benefited Student Athlete Academic Support programs in the Athletics Department, general scholarships as well as faculty development funds.

Glory Educational Resource, Inc., through the generosity of Professor Jonathon Lin, donated more than \$20,000 in fiscal year 2002-03 to benefit scholarships and research opportunities in the Department of Industrial Technology.
