



What it is:

The **Eagles Nest Project** is a precedent-setting effort to build a **Habitat for Humanity** home in the Ypsilanti community. It is also the first partnership between Eastern Michigan University, through the VISION office in the EMU Student Center, and Habitat for Humanity of Huron Valley.

The project is a **two-fold effort**,

- A) First we have to **raise \$65,000** for the cost of construction materials, either in cash or in equivalent in-kind donations.
- B) Gather enough volunteers, both skilled and unskilled, and **physically build** the house.

Besides helping a local family move into their own home, the project is a collaboration between the university and the community. This effort is designed to bring together everyone who benefits from the development of affordable housing, which means that **everyone is invited to help** regardless of affiliation with the community or campus.
