As a part of the Public Safety Program at LISD, I have had the privilege to oversee and develop a highly successful program that has provided a solid, sometimes life-altering, foundation for young people from a variety of educational and social backgrounds, that were interested in careers in Public Safety. I believe this program has helped some of the young people overcome obstacles and achieve.

Key results:

- Even though 30% of the program participants have been identified as having some level of learning disability, 80% of participants have gone on to some level of higher or post-secondary education.
- Designed and implemented Differentiated Instruction methodologies, and assessment tools.
- Focus on developing student's abilities to work with others in groups, with a focus on development of presentation skills, technical reading, note taking and technical writing skills.
- Through the use of teaching modalities that included an open architecture classroom setting, students that were otherwise at risk of falling short of their academic potential are able to focus and complete assignments and coursework through an encouraging and tailored delivery of teaching strategies resulting in positive outcomes, academically and personally.
- Work hand in hand with an Advisory board of Industry professionals to develop a budget for materials, as well as develop curriculum.
