DR. SHU WANG

Shu Wang joined the Political Science Department Faculty in Fall 2021. In her first year at EMU, she taught the Public Policy course and the Local Governments and Politics course for the MPA program.

Regarding her current research interests, she shared, "Although my main area of research is public finance, I have started broadening the scope of my work to other areas related to local government. One of my current projects examines how local governments collaborate for climate change actions. I am reviewing local sustainability plans and interviewing local policymakers for this project. Social equity is an important component for environmental justice and has been a focus of my research, too. For example, I investigated the uneven paces of recovery within a metropolitan area (for example, the stark difference between Highland Park and West Bloomfield

within the Detroit metro), and examined its implications for residents' quality of life."

Regarding what she enjoys so far about EMU, Dr. Wang shared, "I find myself using the word 'wholesome' a lot when describing my experience at EMU. I am thankful for the supportive environment here that enables me to grow as a scholar and educator. I am also very impressed by the diversity of students, not only by race and ethnicity but also by life experiences. I learn a great deal from the students; they provide me with perspectives to education and motivate me to be a more effective educator."

Dr. Shu Wang and James Tatum, adjunct professor in the MPA program, are coauthors of a <u>study about the City of Flint's financial condition</u> published by the University of Michigan's Center for Local, State, and Urban Policy.

OUTSTANDING PUBLIC ADMINISTRATOR AWARD RECIPIENT, JACQUELINE BEAUDRY

The EMU MPA Program is proud to recognize Jacqueline Beaudry as the 2022 "Public Administrator of the Year." The following is an excerpt of Dr. Joe Ohren's speech for Jackie, 2003 EMU MPA alumna who now serves as Ann Arbor's city clerk:

As Clerk, Jackie manages the office and serves on the city administrator's executive team. As Election Supervisor, Jackie has made Ann Arbor a model of effective election operations by, for example, implementing new voting systems making voter registration easier and more



secure, creating a real-time polling place line tracking program, establishing a satellite polling place primarily for student voters at the University of Michigan Museum of Art, sponsoring a student election inspector program for high school students with the AAPS district, piloting implementation of new statewide systems for voter registration and voting, among other unique and creative ways of making voting in Ann Arbor more accessible.

My guess is that until 2020 most of us really didn't know what clerks did in local government—the common notion of clerk implies some administrative or secretarial responsibilities. Who goes to graduate school to take a clerk's position?

Can you imagine a more challenging position to be in right now? Dealing with the challenges to mail-in ballots, limits on hours of election, the placement and security of vote collection boxes, handling security with election inspectors who may be armed and may even have expanded authority to challenge the vote counting process? She and her staff in the Clerk's Office are truly Civic Heroes!

Everything that Jackie has done thus far in her role in Ann Arbor suggests that she can manage the demands that are being placed on her. **She has**

demonstrated leadership in adapting the efforts of her office to accommodate the many challenges that the virus wrought, has been committed to expanding access to the voting process, and has been exemplary in experimenting with new approaches at cooperation and collaboration with other entities to achieve the mission of her office.

Jackie has recognized and used her positional and personal influence to expand and strengthen the role that the Clerk's office plays in a functioning democracy. She may not think of it in those philosophical terms, but free and fair elections are the foundation of democracy.

For all that she has done and will undoubtedly continue to do, we honor Jacqueline Beaudry, 2022 Outstanding Public Administrator.

NICOLETTE BATESON RECEIVES THE EMU ALUMNI ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



This year, the Eastern Michigan University Office for Alumni Relations recognized Nicolette Bateson, 2012 EMU MPA alumna, as a recipient of the Alumni Achievement Award. This award is presented to alumni who have achieved distinction in their chosen field, clearly demonstrated the value of their college education, and maintained a continuing interest in Eastern Michigan University. Generally, recipients have been graduates of EMU for 10 to 25 years.

In her current role as the Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer of the Great Lakes Water Authority, Nickie worked to transform the City of Detroit's Water and Sewage Department into the successful regional authority it is today – and in the process, saved \$1 billion in debt service charges. Nickie has served on the EMU MPA Advisory Board since 2015. Dr. Jeffrey Bernstein shared, "Nickie has served as a member of the MPA Advisory Board, regularly attending our meetings and offering her guidance and wisdom to help guide the program. She has attended alumni events, spoken

with students who wanted career guidance in her field, and has met with job candidates as part of our faculty searches. I could always call her (and often did) for guidance and insight as I was making programmatic decisions. I trusted her advice completely, and was always grateful by how much she gave back to the university."

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: DAVID PALMER

David Palmer, 2014 EMU MPA alumnus, conducted <u>research regarding single-family housing</u> in collaboration with Southwest Economic Solutions and the University of Michigan Center for Equitable Family & Community Well-Being. David provides a summary of the report: "The report notes that nearly 7,500 Detroiters participated in homebuyer education programming in Detroit between 2014-2019, but less than 1,500 report purchasing a home. Program participants closely mirror the demographics and income levels of Detroiters. In about 2/3 of the city, less than 20% of annual home sales are purchased using a mortgage. The vast majority of Prop N homes targeted for "stabilization" with publicly financed bond dollars are in neighborhoods with very low mortgage activity, meaning it is unlikely that median income Detroiters will be able to purchase these homes receiving public investment." David explores opportunities for solutions to these challenges in this OpEd <u>article</u>.



David was recently awarded one of two 2022 Michigan State University Innovation Fellowships. With this fellowship, he will be collaborating with a wide range of organizations to build out the solutions matrix noted in the OpEd mentioned previously.
