Model UN: 22 students participated at the American Model United Nations (AMUN) conference in Chicago Nov. 19—22, 2016. The countries represented were Nicaragua and Syria, for which students won awards for their representation. March 19-24, 2017, eleven EMU students traveled to New York to participate in the National Model United Nations (NMUN) conference. The EMU delegation, representing Mozambique, won a Distinguished Delegation award for outstanding work. Earlier in the winter semester, EMU students participated in the Dayton Model United Nations conference in Ohio and a Model Arab League conference at Grand Valley State University.

Moot Court: Our moot court team began its season with news that it ranked 14th in the country after a mere three years. This year, they fielded 8 teams. Five of those teams made it to the second round of regionals and two teams qualified for the national finals in Tampa, FL in early January 2017.

Mock Trial: With fourteen new members, our mock trial team attended four invitational tournaments, including the Great Lakes Invitational held in the hallowed halls of Pray-Harrold. The team continues to improve and finished the Fall invitational season with a 4th place along with numerous individual awards. Led by team captains Jordan Giles (2016) and Sarah Reasoner (2018), the team enjoyed continued success in the winter semester and the beginning of AMTA sanctioned tournaments.
