Criteria for evaluating candidates include: grade point average overall and in psychology, quality of letters of recommendation, and participation/ leadership in activities that enrich the Psychology Department and the profession.

McKeachie Award. The McKeachie Award is awarded to the person who gave the best presentation or had the best poster at the annual Undergraduate Arts and Sciences Symposium. Faculty and the Department Head evaluate student presentations at this symposium and a committee makes a determination prior to the Department's Annual Honors Reception.
