Examples of Potential Strategic Action Statements in the Context of the Academic Affairs Vision Framework (June 2004)

Direction 1 – Strong Undergraduate Programs

- Create student-centered co-curricular initiatives that help attract and retain students
- Increase co-curricular programs and services supporting first-year students
- Initiate and support co-curricular programs to attract talented high school students to campus
- Expand co-curricular programming providing leadership development training and experiences.
- Increase collaboration between academic and co-curricular programs aimed at preventing, identifying and addressing academic dishonesty

Direction 2 – Synergy of Theory and Practice in Graduate Programs

- Increase the utilization of non-academic units as settings for experiential learning
- Provide support and training to graduate assistants in handling disruptive conduct, academic dishonesty and sexual harassment

Direction 3 – Model for Public Engagement

- Maintain and expand relationships based on co-curricular programs and services
- Develop an expanded array of student housing options in the community

Direction 4 – Model for Principles of Diversity and Inclusion

- Insure that outside speakers at co-curricular activities and events reflect the diversity of the campus.
- Develop a campus environment that respects individual differences and is inclusive and accepting of all students.

Direction 5 – Global and Multicultural Perspectives

- Expand co-curricular programming offering international cultural, social, and volunteer experiences
- Develop and offer programs and services designed to ease the transitions of international students

Direction 6 – Improve Institutional Effectiveness

- Seek grant and corporate sponsorship for current and new co-curricular programs and services
- Expand the use of customer service assessments and program evaluations of co-curricular programs and services.
