#### **Junior Scholars**

On Saturday, January 9th, Upward Bound debuted it's newest program component: Junior Scholars. This new program is designed to prepare Upward Bound juniors for the SAT and assist them in the college research process. By completing their college research in their junior year, they will be ready to apply to the colleges of their choice at the start of Senior Seminar in the fall.

As part of Junior Scholars, students will create a portfolio demonstrating what they have learned. If students complete all the portfolio requirements satisfactorily and don't miss more than one session, they will earn a special Upward Bound tassel to wear at their high school graduation!

Junior Scholars meets every other Saturday from 10am— 12pm in 110 Halle Library on EMU's campus. Sessions are required of all Juniors. The remaining dates are listed below:

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#### Share Your Story: Michelle Douglas, Upward Bound Alumna

Since we were kids, my brother Danny and I dreamed of graduating from the University of Michigan. If we accomplished this we would be the first in our family to graduate from college. Since our parents did not graduate from college, they didn't have much advice for us. Moreover, neither of my grandfathers finished high school. I never got the chance to meet them, but I am told their dream was for my parents and us to live better lives with more opportunities. My parents started accomplishing that dream by getting their high school diplomas, and I know they would have graduated from college had Upward Bound been available to them.

That is why we are all so grateful that Upward Bound provided Danny and me with the tools and resources to be successful in college. In our first year at university we were confident in our ability to study, manage time, be organized, and set realistic goals.

I started Upward Bound with a low GPA, but with the help of my tutors in College Club and by using the strategies I learned during monthly Group Meetings, I was able to greatly raise my GPA. However, I applied to five colleges and only got into two. I was not going to let that stop me from accomplishing my dream. I went to Washtenaw Community College and worked hard to receive a 3.89 (a B+ away from my goal of a 4.0.). I then applied to the University of Michigan and got in! I will never forget the moment I found out! I then achieved my dream and graduated in 2012 from U of M. After graduation, I taught English in Spain for a year - a goal I set in my ninth grade Spanish class. Next, I hope to attend graduate school to become a Spanish teacher. I know I will accomplish this goal using the skills I learn from Upward Bound.

As for Danny, he also achieved his dream and graduated from U of M in 2013 using the tools he learned from UB. He graduated with a double major in Communication Studies and Spanish. Danny remembers telling a College Club tutor that his dream has always been to work in the sports broadcasting industry. The tutor advised him to major in communications and get involved in clubs that would give him experience in the industry. So Danny joined the university's student-run network and was later hired for U of M's Big Ten Network Student U. In those positions he gained experience working on various sports shows. After graduating ,Danny accepted a job at the Big Ten Network and is now living his dream. He is working on his next goal to one day be a producer of professional live sporting events.


