

After the admissions presentation, we took a walk to the planetarium and examined the night sky. A video projected onto the ceiling explained how stars are born and die and allowed us to travel the Milky Way from our reclined seats. We learned how to spot the North Star, outlined some constellations, and took a ride on a space roller coaster before heading to lunch.
