MI-CAPP Student Leadership Summit







On March 20, Ms. Fong, Ms. Rankins, and four students: Brandon McCormick, Rodney Cannon, Michaela Justice, and Tori Williams hopped into the Upward Bound van and headed to Traverse City and the Great Wolf Lodge for a conference. Each year, the Michigan College Access Programs and Personnel (MI-CAPP) hosts a Student Leadership Summit and TRiO Day to help high school and college students learn more about TRiO programs like Upward Bound as well as enhance their leadership and college success skills.

Over the three-day event, our students and staff participated in conference workshops such as "Leadership Keys to Success" and "Building Blocks to a Bachelor's Degree." When students were not engaged in workshops, they attended a scholarship banquet honoring TRiO students, had a great time in the Great Wolf Lodge water park, walked on Lake Michigan, and learned some new travel games. We even met former EMU Upward Bound student Kendra Caldwell, who is now excelling at Michigan State University and was asked to be one of the panel speakers at the conference! We were also happy that, despite Ms. Fong's *repeated* declarations, no bears were seen! Rodney, Tori, Michaela, and Brandon made our Upward Bound family very proud and felt that the conference was very beneficial. The staff agreed and hopes that with scholarship nominations sent to the conference committee next year, we'll see some of our own Upward Bound students honored at the scholarship banquet.

During the month of February at College Club, students participated in Black History Month Jeopardy, an idea brought to life by veteran tutor Tyra Martin. "One day, [a student] and I were talking about the movie Selma, and what [the student] said broke my heart."
