AFTER-THE-FACT STRATEGIES

Report the incident, with or without names

Consider talking with a trusted authority figure (e.g., Diversity and Community Involvement, advisor, faculty member, family, coach)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This program teaches participants how to safely respond to bullying, injustices, and discrimination on and off campus. Participants gain a better understanding of the "bystander effect" and what influences a person's willingness to help or not, and develop skills for analyzing and responding to issues of injustice.

Bystander effect: Social phenomenon in which the presence of others reduces helping behavior

ASSESS THE SITUATION

What does your GUT tell you?
Ask yourself, "Could I play a role here?"
If no one intervenes, what will likely happen?
Is someone else better able to respond?
Where should I respond and what would be my purpose?
Vould I be putting myself at risk?
Should I act NOW or LATER ?

Use humor (with care)
Point to the elephant in the room
Interrupt the behavior
Silent stare
We're friends, right?
Personalize

Assume naiveté
