Scholarships for International Graduate Students

To attract talented students from around the world, Eastern Michigan University is offering the National Scholars and Student Success Programs. These programs award scholarships to incoming graduate students who have demonstrated academic excellence and plan to pursue their education at EMU.

The National Scholars Program (NSP) valued at \$10,288 per academic year for two years, will pay the out-of-state differential for incoming students. You may qualify for the NSP scholarship if your cumulative GPA is 3.6 or higher from the equivalent of a US bachelor's degree.

The Student Success Program (SUCG) is valued at \$3,100 per academic year for two years and is available for incoming students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or higher. *If awarded the NSP, you are not eligible for the Student Success Award.

To be eligible, students must be admitted as a Non-Resident for tuition purposes. Students who already have post bachelor's work completed are not eligible. Students admitted to a certificate or non-degree program at EMU are not eligible. Students who have a Graduate Assistantship position at EMU, or who have a government or agency scholarship are not eligible. The NSP/SUCG are for those seeking a first master's degree.

Please note that the scholarship is determined at the time of admission based on the decision GPA. It is eligible for new (not already enrolled) students to EMU. Awards are posted to student accounts in September and January. Students are automatically considered for the NSP/SUCG through the admission application. Students need to be admitted to the university before the Financial Aid priority deadline to be considered (May 1st for Fall and October 15th for Winter).
