## More about EMU

### Admission Requirements

English requirements are based on the scores of TOEFL, IELTS, MELAB or Pearson's. Minimum requirements are subject to change from department to department. When students cannot meet the minimum requirements, conditional admission may be offered.

EMU offers an English as a Second Language (ESL) program that not only helps you improve your English, but classes can also be counted as credit hours towards graduation if you are an undergraduate student.

Admissions to the graduate programs may GRE, GMAT or other tests. The MBA does not require work experience for admissions.

### International Student Life

The Office of International Students provides assistance in housing, academics, and cultural adjustment. EMU has more than 340 student organizations including international clubs on campus.

## Career Development

Some majors require some level of work experience/internship as a part of the degree program that encourage students to earn practical experience while they are studying.

The Career Services Center provides employment information to all EMU students/alumni and helps in preparing resumes and practicing job interview skills.

## Academic Life

Professors are very experienced. Most instructors have a PhD in a related field. Many professors hire students to work in the labs or assist with research. The average student-teacher ratio is 19:1.

EMU also offers scholarships for successful students.

## English as a Second Language (ESL) Program

**Passing scores- TOEFL IBT GR- 79, UG- 61; IELTS GR-6.5, UG 6; MELAB GR 77, UG 72; Pearson's GR 54, UG- 44.**

EMU offers two types of ESL admissions: Intensive ESL only (non degree admissions) and Academic ESL (degree admissions).

The English as a Second Language program (ESL) at EMU prepares international students, scholars and professionals to effectively use English language skills and academic strategies to confidently and successfully participate in academic study in university programs.

The goal of the ESL Program is to provide non-native English-speaking students with the resources and opportunities to develop their reading, writing, listening and speaking skills to a level appropriate for university study and to equip them with the academic strategies necessary for successful study in a language and culture that may differ from their native language and/or culture.

### Top 10 Reasons to Study ESL at EMU

1. Flexible admission options for students.
2. Conditional ESL students have full degree admission to EMU.
3. Conditional ESL students receive academic credit for each ESL course. Undergraduate students may apply ESL credits to elective course requirements in their graduation requirements. Graduate students may apply ESL credits to their program of study with the permission of their program advisor.
4. When ESL students are in the 400 or 500 level, they may take courses in their major/program at the same time.

5. All instructors have a PhD or Master’s degree in TESOL or a related field.
6. The ESL Program is integrated on the EMU campus; it is not separated from the campus.
7. Students have many opportunities to experience the culture by getting involved in student clubs, activities and organizations on campus.
8. Students meet other students from all over the world.
9. Students save money and graduate sooner by taking ESL classes for credit.
10. ESL students have full access to EMU campus resources (computer labs, library, fitness facility, health center, campus life activities, etc)

## Notes

- Students are placed into ESL courses according to the sub-scores on the basis of TOEFL, MELAB, IELTS, or Pearson’s scores.
- All ESL courses are 3 credit hours each.
- Once students are enrolled in ESL courses, they must complete the sequence of ESL courses, or test out of the ESL program completely (by submitting a new TOEFL/IELTS/MELAB/ Pearson’s score). Once enrolled in ESL courses, students may not submit new sub scores to skip levels or test out of individual skills.

The application fee is \$35 and can be paid by a credit card (Visa/MasterCard/Discover) or in person.

## Paper Application

The application fee is \$35, and only a money order or a check from a U.S. affiliated bank payable to Eastern Michigan University is acceptable. Cash or postal orders are NOT accepted.

## Documents Needed for Application

### Transcripts (individual mark sheets), Academic Record, etc.

#### Directions for freshmen:

An original transcript or true attested copy of the academic record in the original language from: each secondary school if you are a freshman (if you are a high school student applying).

These documents must be submitted directly from the degree granting institution with an official Registrar university seal on the attested credential and the envelope (non-opened). Student copies, faxes, photocopies or documents signed by unauthorized individuals will not be considered official. A key of the grading system should be included. If the document is not automatically issued in English, a literal, word for word English translation from a translation service must also be provided (students cannot do their own translations).

#### Directions for transfer, second bachelor's or undergraduate post bachelor's students:

**Educational Perspectives:** EP is the credential evaluation service where EMU applicants need to send their international educational credentials for an evaluation. All applicants with international credentials, except freshman (that means you never attended any post-secondary institutions), must submit an evaluation done by EP of all of their post-secondary credentials.

Order the Course by Course Service for \$135.00. EP may require an English translation in

order to complete the evaluation. Send all the documents together because one evaluation fee covers the evaluations of all the academic history (if you do not send everything together, the evaluation cannot be completed or you will have to pay extra). The evaluation takes five business days from when it is ordered once EP determines the information that was sent to them is complete. EP will send the completed evaluation to the student and EMU. Visit the EMU EP web site: <http://www.edperspective.org/emich> for details on how to submit the evaluation request. This evaluation will be used to determine if your institution(s) is/are recognized to make you eligible for admissions at EMU, it will be used to determine your Grade Point Average (GPA), and it will be used to determine if you are eligible for any transfer credit. EMU no longer requires that you send your educational documents directly to us. You must get an evaluation from EP. If you are admitted while you are still finishing your current semester of post-secondary coursework, you will need to forward EP your final transcripts/mark sheets for an additional evaluation of credit. EP will evaluate that for an additional \$50.00. This is mandatory for all students with international post-secondary credentials who enroll at EMU.

### **Financial Statement for International Applicants**

Admitted students will need an I-20 to get a visa and enter the USA. An I-20 is issued by EMU and mailed to students. For a university to be able to issue this document, the student should provide financial statement showing sufficient funds to cover at least one academic year.

In order to receive an I-20 from EMU, you must also submit the most recent Financial Statement for International Applicants, provided by Eastern Michigan University. This document must contain original signatures; faxes or photocopies are not considered official. The form of financial statement can be reached at

### Current passport

You must include a copy of your current passport or your National Identity Card in order for us to produce an I-20.

### English proficiency

An official score report received directly from one of the following: the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), International English Language Test System (IELTS), the Michigan English Language Assessment Battery (MELAB), or the Pearson Test of English (PTE) must be sent by the testing service directly to the University. Student score reports, faxes or photocopies will not be considered official.

Minimum score requirements for undergraduate applicants:

TOEFL iBT: 61	IELTS: 6	MELAB: 72	PTE : 44
TOEFL PBT: 500			

A conditional admission may be available for those who fall just below the minimum score requirements.

In addition ACT/SAT examinations are accepted. ACT/SAT Official Score Reports must be sent directly from the testing agency. EMU's school code for ACT is 1990. EMU's School code for SAT is 1201. Only one of these tests is a requirement if you completed your secondary education here in the United States. ACT or SAT test scores may be used to waive the English proficiency test requirement; the English sub score or Critical Reasoning sub score must be at least a 19 or 430, respectively.

## Release form

A completed Information Release form including an original signature by the applicant must be submitted if information is to be released to anyone other than the prospective student. This form is available on our web site and it may be faxed. It is valid only for applicants from outside of the US who do not have access to e-mail.

## Notes

- Misrepresentation of facts may be cause for refusal of admission, cancellation of admission, or suspension or dismissal from the University if discovered subsequently. Students must fill out their own application materials, not a third party. All credentials submitted in support of the application become the property of the University and are not returnable.

- EMU requires students to fill out their own application materials. I-20s are sent to the student's address, not an agent's address.

## Scholarships

### The National Scholars Program (NSP) Scholarship

NSP is a renewable award which pays the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition (approximately \$14,492 per year). It is open to incoming freshman with a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale. To be eligible, you must be admitted as a non resident for tuition purposes.

The NSP is also available for students who have completed 30 transferable credits prior to admission.

## Work Opportunities

To get a good job and to be successful in a future career is one of the most important goals for many students. EMU understands this very well and therefore provides several employment options for international students.

### On-Campus Jobs

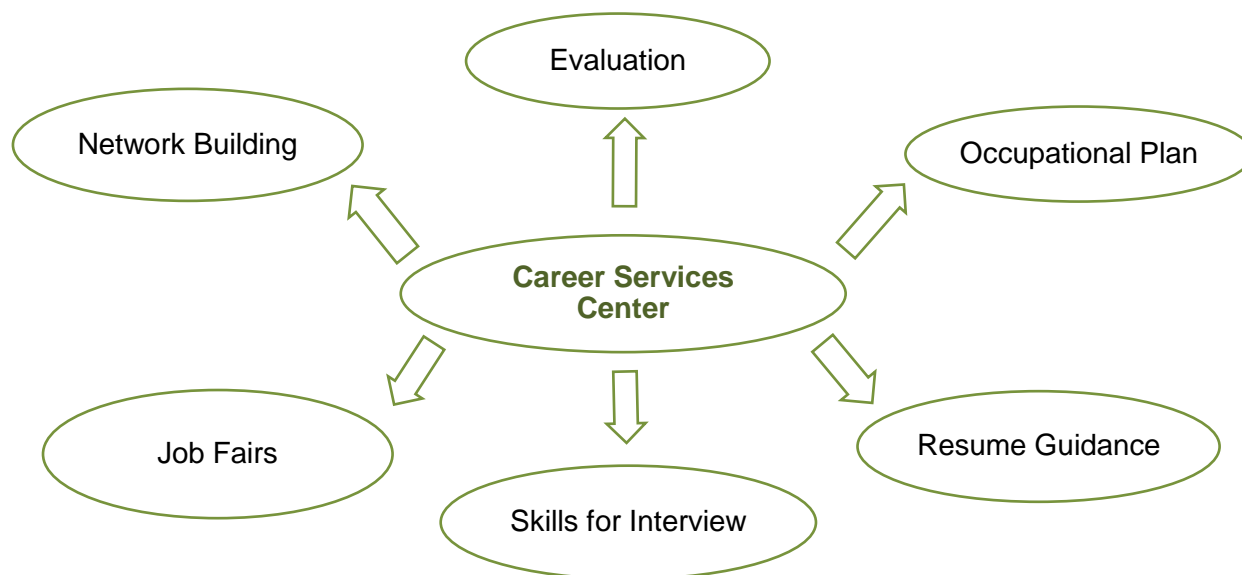

## Honors College

The Honors College at Eastern Michigan University provides highly qualified and motivated students a small college experience with all the benefits of a large comprehensive university.

Special classes, research projects, community service experiences, social ties with others Honors students and senior faculty interactions are just some of the elements of Honors which will help you make the most of your undergraduate experience.

Each year, the Honors College approximately admits 250 students each year and students of any major is eligible to apply.

### Admission Requirements

The Honors College seeks talented students with demonstrated intellectual achievement who desire a challenging academic program. A majority of students enter as freshman, but many enter later in their EMU undergraduate careers and as transfer students from other colleges.

Competitive applicants newly out of high school typically have at least a GPA of a 3.5 out of 4, however the criteria considered by the admissions committee include:

- Previous academic performance
- Class rank
- ACT scores
- Letters of recommendation
- Personal essay describing personal, academic and professional goals

## Honors College Program

### University Honors

Students in the first and second year of college pursue a course of study leading to University Honors distinction. This is achieved when students complete 24 honors credits: at least 18 in general education courses and at least three (3) in a major or minor field. Students select from about 50 honors sections of general education courses offered by the college each semester. In addition, University Honors students must complete 40 hours of community service and designated cultural, intellectual, and leadership activities.

### Departmental Honors

Once students have declared their major, they may pursue Departmental Honors, leading to distinction in the major or minor. Departmental Honors require 12 credits of honors coursework in the major or minor including the senior thesis/project. These credits are typically arranged by Honors College advisory faculty in the academic departments.

### Highest Honors

Highest Honors recognizes students who satisfy both University and Departmental Honors requirements.

### Community Engagement

The Honors College provides research opportunities where talented EMU Honors students and committed faculty work together to present scholarly work at major university conferences.

Scholarships and grants are also available in the Honors College to support study abroad, the senior thesis and conference travel. In addition, Honors students receive many of the University's merit-based awards.

Students pursuing University Honors participate in cultural excursions and leadership activities for personal and professional development. Students have an opportunity to become a leader in

the Honors Students Association (HSA) and participate in community service drives with students who are as engaged and driven as they are.

## Exemplary Academics

Honors advisers practice individual advising to help Honors students select classes, understand academic requirements, and find relevant financial aid opportunities.

Honors College students receive the benefit of priority registration which will allow you to be among the first students to register for classes.

With an enrollment cap of 20 students, Honors sections of General Education classes allow you to understand material in more depth through rich discussion and group activities.

Honors College graduates are recognized at a special commencement reception, and honors distinction is designated on final transcripts.

Departmental Honors students must complete a senior honors thesis requiring advanced work in their academic field.

## Campus Safety

Eastern Michigan University cares about student, faculty and staff safety by doing the following:

- Added more than 200 cameras located in the interior and exterior of the academic and residence hall buildings.
- Enhanced residence hall security by adding swipe cards at entrances of all 11 residence halls. The Village has both swipe cards and keys for the exterior. The First Year Center uses swipe cards for both the exterior doors and for the corridor doors leading to the residences.



- Replaced more than 5,500 locks on campus this past year to help safeguard students, faculty and staff.
- Conducting a comprehensive security audit, which began in January, 2011, through TranSystems Corporation. The purpose of the audit is to identify areas of safety and security improvement and recommend solutions. TranSystems Corporation is identifying areas that EMU can change immediately to make a positive impact on safety and security. After the results are made available, recommendations will be evaluated for implementation.
- Sent 1,000 brochures to faculty and academic department heads to update them on the latest progress in safety efforts. They also received a booklet titled, "Keeping Yourself and Your Classrooms Safe."



- Expanded the number of emergency assistance stations on campus to 58.
- Continued to offer crime prevention programs, including one on tailgating and the Rape Aggression Defense (RAD) classes, and mini safety and security forums for academic buildings and housing units to address specific safety concerns.
- Expanded Student Eyes and Ears for University Safety (SEEUS) patrols seven days a week. The primary purpose of SEEUS is to provide escorts to persons walking alone on campus.
- Created an emergency text-message alert system that will notify students, faculty and staff if an emergency situation occurs on campus. In the event of an emergency, the alerts will automatically be sent through text messages on cell phones and e-mails with real-time information. However, you will need to sign up individually to use the service.
