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Admission Process for the BSW at Eastern Michigan University

Program Admissions Process:

- 1. Submission of a Social Work Admissions application, which is distributed in SWRK 251.
- 2. Earn a grade of "C" or higher in the pre-major social work classes: SWRK 120, 200, 200, 222, 251.
- 3. Completion of 40 hrs of post-high school volunteer, employment or internship experience in a human service setting.
- 4. Submission of a reflective essay completed in SWRK 251.
- 5. Cumulative GPA of 2.3 or higher at time of admission into the BSW program.
- 6. Complete 40 hours of volunteer service, internship experience, or employment within a human service setting.

Students may register in SWRK 200, 222 and 251 at EMU while attending Jackson in order to complete these courses before starting the professional sequence at EMU. Financial aid is not available at both institutions at the same time.

²Students may concurrently register in SWRK 200, 222 and 251 at EMU while attending Jackson; or take during the spring/summer semester prior to starting the Social Work sequence at EMU. These courses are pre-requisites for all upper division SWRK courses.

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Additional Information:

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both institutions agree to accept transferable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions. JC courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's BSW Social Work. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
- 2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" experience, and a "Writing Intensive" course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.

To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as applied to transfer students. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at EMU after August 2019.

- 3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to either institution.
- 4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 51 credit hours must be completed in EMU courses, with at least 15 hours in the program at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 120 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
- 5. Students must satisfy all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. JC students will receive equal consideration with other students for course registration and financial aid.
 - Overall GPA of 2.3 or higher at time of admission to BSW program
 - Submission of an application which will be distributed in SWRK 251.
 - Completion of 40 hrs of post-high school volunteer, employment or internship experience in a human service setting.
 - Completion of introductory social work courses: SWRK 120, SWRK 200, SWRK 222, & SWRK 251 with grades of "C" or higher
 - Submission of a reflective essay completed in SWRK 251.
- 6. Students are encouraged to contact EMU's BSW Student Services Coordinator before applying to EMU. To facilitate advising and the evaluation of transcripts, bring a copy of this articulation guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Date: September 1, 2023 until August 31, 2026.

This is a renewal of an agreement made in September 2008 and renewed in September 2011, September 2014, September 2017, and September 2020. This agreement is consistent with the 2023-2024 catalog. Students have until summer 2031 to graduate from Eastern Michigan University following this agreement. In the event that a student does not complete the program within seven years, they may be required to have their credits reevaluated using the requirements of the current articulation guide.
