Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) Requirements (30 credits)

Students with an MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one Perspectives on a Diverse World course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" experience, and a writing intensive course in the major. 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Additional Information:

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both MCCC and EMU agree to accept transferable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions. MCCC courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's BS in Technology Management program. If not transferred, they must be completed at EMU. Any substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
- 2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" experience, and a "Writing Intensive" course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.
 To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as applied to transfer students. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program. As of fall semester 2019, the MACRAO agreement, which preceded the MTA, will no longer be endorsed by community colleges. If the MACRAO endorsement is already on your transcript, it will be accepted at EMU.
- 3. A grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) is required for courses to transfer to either institution.
- 4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 30 credit hours must be completed in courses offered by EMU, with 15 hours in program requirements, at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, at least 10 hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 total credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
- 5. Students must satisfy all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. MCCC students will receive equal consideration with other students for course registration and financial aid.
- 6. Students are encouraged to contact the Technology Management Program Coordinator before applying to EMU. To facilitate advising and the evaluation of transcripts, you can sign up for the agreement at http://www.emich.edu/ccr/articulation-agreements/signup.php and bring a copy of this guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Dates: September 1, 2019 until August 31, 2022

This is a renewal of an agreement made in November 2004 and renewed in September 2007, June 2011, and January 2016. This agreement is consistent with the 2019-2020 catalog. Students have until summer 2027 to graduate from Eastern Michigan University following this agreement. In the event that a student does not complete the program within seven years, they may be required to have their credits reevaluated using the requirements of a more recent articulation guide.
