Schoolcraft College Courses:**Eastern Michigan University Courses:****Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) Requirements (30 credits)**

Students with an MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one Perspectives on a Diverse World course, one Learning beyond the Classroom experience, and a writing intensive course in the major. Courses listed below for the MTA also satisfy program requirements at EMU. For Schoolcraft courses approved to satisfy the MTA go to [Schoolcraft's website](#).

1. A Course in English Composition

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Admission Process for the BSW at Eastern Michigan University**Program Admissions Process:**

1. Submission of a Social Work Admissions application, which is distributed in SWRK 251.
2. Earn a grade of “C” or higher in the pre-major social work classes: SWRK 120, 200, 200, 222, 251.
3. Completion of 40 hrs of post-high school volunteer, employment or internship experience in a human service setting.
4. Submission of a reflective essay completed in SWRK 251.
5. Cumulative GPA of 2.3 or higher at time of admission into the BSW program.
6. Complete 40 hours of volunteer service, internship experience, or employment within a human service setting.

Students may register in SWRK 200, 222 and 251 at EMU while attending Schoolcraft in order to complete these courses before starting the professional sequence at EMU. Financial aid is not available at both institutions at the same time.

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Additional Information:

1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both institutions agree to accept transferrable courses from each other and from other regionally accredited institutions. SC courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's Bachelor of Social Work. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning Beyond the Classroom" experience, and a "Writing Intensive" course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.
To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript, will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as applied to transfer students. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at EMU after August 2019.
3. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to either institution.
4. Under this agreement, EMU will waive the 60-hour rule and require that a minimum of 51 credit hours must be completed at the four year college level, with 30 hours in EMU courses, with at least 15 hours at the 300-level or above. Of the last 30 hours completed before graduating, a minimum of 10 credit hours must be in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 120 credit hours (Fall 2022), completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
5. Students must satisfy all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to EMU, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. SC students will receive equal consideration with other students for course registration and financial aid.
6. Admission requirements:
 - Submission of a Social Work Admissions application, distributed in SWRK 251.
 - Earn a grade of "C" or higher in the pre-major social work classes: SWRK 120, 200, 200, 222, 251.
 - Completion of 40 hours of post-high school volunteer, employment or internship experience in a human service setting.
 - Submission of a reflective essay completed in SWRK 251.
 - Cumulative GPA of 2.3 or higher at time of admission into the BSW program.
 - Complete 40 hours of volunteer service, internship experience, or employment within a human service setting.
7. Students are encouraged to contact EMU's Bachelor of Social Work program coordinator before applying to EMU. To facilitate advising and the evaluation of transcripts, [sign up for this articulation agreement](#) and bring a copy of this articulation guide to all advising sessions.

Effective Date: September 1, 2019 until August 31, 2022.

This is a renewal of an agreement made in June 2004 and renewed in September 2007, September 2011 and September 2015. This agreement is consistent with the 2019-2020 catalog. Students have until summer 2027 to graduate from Eastern Michigan University following this agreement. In the event that a student does not complete the program within seven years, they may be required to have their credits reevaluated using the requirements of the current articulation guide.
