Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) Requirements (31 credits)

Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the EMU General Education Application Requirements of one Perspectives on a Diverse World course, one Learning beyond the Classroom experience, and one Writing Intensive course in the major. Specific courses listed below for the MTA will satisfy major or minor requirements at WCC and/or EMU. Students who started before Fall 2014 may continue to follow the MACRAO Agreement until the end of summer 2019. Courses approved by WCC to satisfy the MTA can be found by on Washtenaw's website.

Completion of Elementary Education Early Childhood Comprehensive Program at EMU

Admission to Phase I of the Initial Teacher Preparation Program (19 credits)

Students with a community college GPA of 3.0 or higher, who have completed at least 56 transferable credits and a minimum math sub-score of 530 on the SAT or a minimum of 480 on the evidence based reading and writing portion of the SAT. Students who do not meet these requirements must complete at least 12 credits at EMU to establish an overall GPA of 2.5 and a GPA of 2.5 in the major. The courses listed below in the Pre-admission phase may be used for this purpose.

Students should meet with a College of Education advisor early to plan for their first semester

Additional Information:

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction of their individual program and degree requirements. Both WCC and EMU agree to accept transferable courses from each other and from other institutions. WCC courses indicated with an * are required for EMU's Elementary Education Early Childhood Comprehensive Program. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the EMU program coordinator.
- 2. Students with the MTA endorsement on their community college transcript have satisfied EMU's General Education Core Requirements and will be required to complete only the General Education Application Requirements of one "Perspectives on a Diverse World" course, one "Learning beyond the Classroom" experience, and a "Writing Intensive" course in the major. The Perspectives on a Diverse World requirement may be transferred to EMU.
 - To use the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), students must have an official community college transcript, with the "MTA Satisfied" endorsement sent to EMU's Admissions Office. Students who do not have "MTA Satisfied" on their community college transcript will be required to satisfy EMU's general education requirements as applied to transfer students. The MTA may be completed after admission to EMU, however, students should inform their advisors or they may be advised to complete additional courses for the general education program. Students who enrolled in college prior to September 2014 will have until the end of August 2019 to complete the MACRAO agreement. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at EMU after August 2019.
- 3. A grade of "C" or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) is required for courses to transfer to either institution.
- 4. A minimum of 45 semester hours must be completed at the four-year college/university level. At least 9 hours in the major and 6 hours in the minor at the 300- level or above must be completed at EMU. Of the last 30 semester hours prior to graduation, at least 10 hours must be completed in courses offered by EMU. A minimum of 124 credit hours, completed in-residence or accepted in transfer, is required for graduation.
- 5. Criteria for admission to the program:
 - Completion of 56 credits, with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher from all previous institutions, or an EMU (GPA) of 2.5, based on at least 12 EMU credits, and a GPA of 2.5 in the major.
 - If Secondary: A grade of "C" or higher in the following EMU or equivalent courses: WRTG 121, CTAC 124, a QR course, one lab science, all professional education courses, and if special education, PSY 101.
 - If Elementary: A grade of "C" or higher in the following EMU or equivalent courses: ENGL 121, CTAC 124, MATH 108 and 110E, PHY 100, ESSC 202, all professional education courses, all courses "for elementary teachers", and if special education, PSY 101.
 - Official test scores for the Professional Readiness Examination (PRE) or the ACT, or the MME
 - Satisfactory health status; satisfactory social and emotional adjustment; submission of an autobiography; and freedom from any kind of probation.
- 6. Students are required to attend an EMU Elementary Education group advising session and an individual advising session with the EMU Teacher Education Department faculty before applying for admission to EMU. To facilitate the evaluation of transcripts, students should bring a copy of this articulation guide to all advising sessions at EMU.

Effective Dates: January 1, 2018 until January 1, 2021

This is a renewal of an agreement made in January 2012. This agreement is consistent with the 2017-2018 catalog. Students have until summer 2025 to graduate from Eastern Michigan University following this agreement. In the event that a student does not complete the program within seven years, they may be required to have their credits reevaluated using the requirements of the current articulation guide.
