GAMEABOVE COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING & TECHNOLOGY - GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS

GACET DEAN'S RESOURCE BOARD SCHOLARSHIP

Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA, achieve senior status during the period of the award. Student must submit a 200 word goal statement and **letter of recommendation**.

RICHARD & NORMA SARNS SCHOLARSHIP

Applicants must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or above. Must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours for the semester the award is granted; priority given to first time freshmen and then to currently enrolled students.

JAY J. SEAVER SCHOLARSHIP

Applicant must be junior or senior status who exhibits superior academic performance; preference given to minority students and selection based on student's academic record.

John Rini Memorial Scholarship

Applicants must be a member of the Administrative Management Society COT chapter; achieve at least junior status; have a declared major in Administrative Management area and show evidence of leadership and service.

John W. Porter – Graduate Research Excellence Scholarship

Awarded to a returning GACET graduate student who has participated in EMU's graduate research fair.

PEGGY AND BILL MOYLAN SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to Undergraduate or Graduate students enrolled in a declared major in the GACET. Undergraduate student should have completed their general study requirements of 41 credits and Learning beyond the Classroom; overall GPA greater than 2.5 and major GPA greater than 3.0. Graduate student should be fully admitted to their program and met all conditional admission requirements. **Must provide recommendation from Academic Advisor.**

Ford Blue Oval Vehicle Team

Students must demonstrate leadership skills on a vehicle team, enrolled in an Engineering, or Information Technology program. Current sophomore or junior class standing with minimum 3.0 GPA as well as U.S. citizen or permanent resident and able to work in the United States.

ASA

Awarded to currently enrolled GACET student in good academic standing who demonstrates financial need. Recipient must write a 1-2 page essay/letter describing how they meet the criteria and deserves the award (personal financial situation, professional experience and career goals).

Ford Fund

Awarded to undergraduate students (full or part time) currently enrolled in Engineering (Computer, Electrical, Mechanical or PDET), Information Technology and Cybersecurity. Scholarship will be made available to students from underrepresented communities who demonstrate economic need. This will include, but is not limited to, Hispanic/Latino, African American/Black, American Indian and Alaska Native, and First-Generation Students (please address in essay).

SCHOOL OF INFORMATION SECURITY & APPLIED COMPUTING (1A)

ANN M. AND ALLAN S. REMP NETWORK AND INFORMATION SECURITY - ENDOWED

Awarded to students who have successfully completed (with 3.0 average) 6-9 credit hours in Network and Information Security. Student must submit an explanation detailing how they plan on using the award (conference, travel, tuition, research, etc). Freshman are not eligible.

MARK STANISLAV

Awarded to students who are studying Information Assurance and/or Cyber Security with a minimum 2.98 GPA. The Donor requests that the following be taken in consideration and can **be included in your essay: first** generation in family to attend College, achieved goals despite financial and/or other challenges.

Ann M. and Allan R. Remp Network and Information Security - Expendable

To provide support to students studying network and information security who are pursuing research and/or scholarly activities. Undergraduate and transfer students must maintain a 2.75 GPA, Graduate students must maintain a 3.0 GPA. Students must have successfully completed 6-9 credit hours in network and information security courses, cover letter (no longer than one page) detailing how they plan on using the award (conference, tuition, travel, research, etc).

SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING (CAE, CEET, EECE, EET, EM, ME, MET, PC, PDET, QUAL)

CAROLYN MARR THOMSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to Product Design Engineering Technology majors with a cumulative 3.0 GPA; preference given to female applicants.

THOMAS E. STEVENS MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to sophomores, juniors, and seniors with a declared MET major with a minimum 3.0 GPA. **Preference** given to student that brings creativity to their academic activities and illustrates a cooperative spirit in teamwork activities and submit a personal statement that articulates their interest in Mechanical Engineering Technology and why they should receive this award.

ERVIN INDUSTRIES SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students (preference to those entering college for the first time or transfer students) who intend to major with a degree from the School of Engineering; a cumulative 2.5 GPA; must be enrolled a minimum of 6 credit hours.

RYAN FOX MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP Awarded to a junior or senior student with a 2.8 minimum GPA.

MAX KANAGY SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to undergraduate or graduate students; one scholarship per year fall term only. Preference given to undergraduate juniors and seniors with a 3.0 GPA and 3.5 for graduates. Must provide **letter of recommendation from past or current employer(s);** must demonstrate professional promise and entrepreneurial ambition; must submit a personal statement about goals.

ENGINEERING FACULTY AND ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded one scholarship per year for fall only. Preference given to junior or senior students with 3.0 GPA and graduate students with 3.2 GPA; must **provide two letters of recommendation**; must demonstrate professional promise and entrepreneurial ambition; must submit a personal statement on goals and future ambition in the industry.

DONALD J. PURDIE, SR. AND FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP IN ENGINEERING

Awarded to an undergraduate student major in Engineering, demonstrates professional promise, with preference given to students completing their final year of the program in need of assistance to complete degree.

CHARLES H. PARKER & JOHN A. GORDON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students in the Polymers & Coatings curriculum. Selection made at the discretion of the school director or program coordinator.

JOHN C. GRAHAM MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to Polymers & Coatings majors (all academic levels will be considered) who have a 3.0 GPA or above.

KUO CHANG-PEI

Awarded to graduate student in the Polymers & Coatings curriculum with a minimum 3.5 GPA.

POLYMERS AND COATINGS SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to a student majoring in Polymers & Coatings with a minimum 3.5 GPA for a graduate student.

SHERWIN-WILLIAMS SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to a full-time student majoring in Polymers & Coatings with a minimum 3.5 graduate GPA.

Albert C. Bean Jr.

Graduate student currently enrolled in Polymers & Coatings with 3.5 GPA.

GDB INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP IN POLYMERS & COATINGS

Graduate student currently enrolled in Polymers & Coatings to support their research activities in the sustainability and recycling of paint and coatings materials.

IFEMEJE/GREENFIELD

Applicant must provide **letter of recommendation** and 1-page personal statement stating their background history and future goals. Preference given to Electrical and Computer Engineering majors that show great talent, versatility, and promise. Secondary preference given to School of Engineering majors.

School of Technology & Professional Services Management (avft. avmg, bmmt, dots, hrm, legl, tm, ts)

ALICE W. CALLUM PARALEGAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students in Paralegal Studies; preference given to junior or senior with 3.0 GPA; must submit letter stating goals and why applicant should be considered; preference given to applicants who are active in community service.

COCA COLA SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students who have earned 56 credits toward their degree; having completed their first HRM cooperative study rotation and are in good academic standing.

Polly and Jim Buchanan Hospitality Management Scholarship

Awarded to HRM major at the sophomore level or above, including graduate students; must have a 2.3 GPA or higher and dedication to completing degree; interest in the hospitality industry by shown work experience and/or support for the student club or other industry related activities. Award can only be received once.

DR. ROSE C. WINGO SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to Bachelor of Business Education (BMMT) student with a cumulative 2.5 GPA; completed BMMT 251; **must express in essay a desire to become a teacher**; enrolled in a minimum of 8 credit hours during the semester awarded.

EARL C. MEYER COLLEGIATE DECA SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students whose major is Business, Management, Marketing and Technology (BMMT) with a minimum 3.0 GPA and outstanding service to EMU.

GEORGE A. WILLOUGHBY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to Bachelor of Business Education (BMMT) student with outstanding achievement and/or outstanding promise for contribution in the field of industrial education.

JULIUS M. ROBINSON SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students majoring in Bachelor of Business Education (BMMT); then secondary education if such curriculum is not offered; have completed 75 credit hours; junior standing with one full semester taken at EMU.

RHONDA M. GAYLEARD SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to Bachelor of Business Education (BMMT) majors who have a 3.0 GPA or above.

MORELL D. BOONE SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students seeking a Master of Science (MS) in Technology Studies degree with a 3.0 GPA or better. Students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 credits per semester.

GRAINGER FOUNDATION INDUSTRIAL DISTRIBUTION

Awarded to junior or senior students majoring in Industrial Distribution and demonstrated merit through coursework or service.

TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

Student majoring in Technology Management, must submit an essay not to exceed 200 words describing the difference a scholarship would make to the student's pursuit of a degree in TM.

NEWBERRY SCHOLARSHIP

Student must be a 2nd year or later, registered for at least 12 credit hours, carry at least a 2.5 GPA and write a single page essay explaining why you deserved the award. If selected, the student must agree to attend a Chapter 55 monthly meeting to explain how you intend to use the award to prepare for your career. Recipient will receive a free one-year membership to EAAA Chapter 55.

SIDETRACK SCHOLARSHIP FOR SERVICE INDUSTRY AND ENTREPRENEURIAL EXCELLENCE

Undergraduate preference given to juniors and seniors, women with an expressed interest in the food service industry, applicants currently working in the food service industry. 3.0 GPA required for undergraduate students. Applicant must provide two letters of recommendation from past or current service industry employers and include a personal statement outlining their commitment to the service industry and entrepreneurial endeavors.

TOWER INN CAFE

Student must have a declared major in Hotel and Restaurant Management, show professional promise and entrepreneurial talent, submit goal statement as well as a letter of recommendation from employer in food service agency. Undergraduate student must have a 2.5 academic record from a community college or other University in Michigan.

Susan & Janet Tkachik

Student must have declared major in the Aviation Flight Technology program, submit goal statement, letter of recommendation, with preference given to full time students with financial needs and actively enrolled in EMU. Students must have a 2.75 academic record from a community college of other University in Michigan.

LT. COL. CHARLES S. KETTLES

Awarded to an undergraduate student whose minimum GPA is 3.0, a junior or senior majoring in either Aviation Management Technology or Aviation Flight Technology.

HANS E. HARRIS

Student recipients will be ones who show fortitude in their belief of flying. Students of any class level with a minimum 2.0 GPA will be eligible if they show a determination to fly despite obstacles they might have in life. Preference will be given to students who are underserved and/or underrepresented in the Aviation Industry and who show financial need (address in essay).

SCHOOL OF VISUAL & BUILT ENVIRONMENTS (ATM, CMT, CNST, IDE, SAG)

Grace Fuller Scholarship

Awarded to a junior or senior majoring in ATM/FMI; has a cumulative 3.0 GPA and selection based upon scholarly performance and leadership potential.

Frances G. Sanderson Scholarship

Awarded to undergraduate in ATM/FMI program who demonstrates leadership ability, motivation, and commitment along with scholastic performance.

Dr. James Stein Construction Management Scholarship

One scholarship is available per year, awarded during the Fall term. Awarded to both undergraduate (3.0 GPA) and graduate (3.5 GPA) students in the Construction Management program; undergraduate preference is given to juniors and seniors and to applicants with expressed interest in entrepreneurship within the construction industry. Applicant must provide (2) letters of recommendation from past or current employers, demonstrate professional promise and entrepreneurial ambition and submit a personal statement about goals in the construction industry.

Dr. John A. Weeks Construction Management Scholarship

Awarded to Construction Management majors who are members of Eastern Constructors, a student member of the American Institute of Constructors (AIC), and have earned a minimum of 48 credit hours toward a CNST degree. The applicant must also have at least one full academic year left subsequent to the application deadline. Applicant must submit (2) two letters of recommendation from faculty with the application.

Fred Wright Construction Management Scholarship

Awarded to Construction Management majors achieving junior or senior status with a cumulative 3.0 GPA.

Industrial Power Systems Inc. Construction Management Scholarship

Awarded to Construction Management students with a 2.8 GPA or above; preference given to child/grandchild of current Industrial Power Systems employee or child/grandchild of a furnished list of a construction trade organization, and students who are in-coming.

Joe O'Neal Scholarship

Awarded to Construction Management that shows professional promise and entrepreneurial talent. Must have 2.5 GPA from Community College or University in Michigan. Financial resources a consideration.

John and Michelle Bodary/Woods Construction Scholarship

One scholarship awarded per year for the fall term only. Both undergraduate and graduate students in Construction Management are eligible. For undergraduates preference is given to juniors and seniors with an expressed interest in entrepreneurship within the construction industry; 3.0 GPA for undergraduates and 3.5 GPA for graduates; must provide (2) two letters of recommendation from past or present employers; must demonstrate professional promise and entrepreneurial ambition and provide a personal statement on goals in the construction industry.

Mans Lumber and Millwork Scholarship

Awarded to full-time student with a declared major in Construction Management, cumulative 3.0 GPA or better, preference given to students that went to a Southeastern Michigan high school.

RYAN MATTHEW CLARK ENDOWED CONSTRUCTION SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to junior/senior majoring in Construction Management, with a minimum 2.5 GPA.

TURNER CONSTRUCTION SCHOLARSHIP

Available to undergraduate and graduate students who are majoring in Construction Management. For undergraduate students with preference given to junior/seniors with 3.0 GPA or higher; graduate students must have a 3.5 GPA or higher. Applicants must submit a personal statement about their goals in the construction industry and (2) two letters of recommendation from current or prior employers.

JONES-BECKWITH ADVANCED GRADUATE STUDIES SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students with cumulative 3.5 GPA seeking Masters in Interior Design or Ph.D. in Technology with concentration in Interior Design; with **15 or more graduate credits completed** toward degree prior to the award semester.

JONES-BECKWITH GRADUATE STUDIES SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students with cumulative 3.5 GPA seeking Masters in Interior Design or Ph.D. in Technology with concentration in Interior Design; has less than 15 graduate credits completed toward degree.

NATALIE SUROVELL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students majoring in Interior Design and show need of financial assistance. Financial need to be expressed in essay with application.

VIRGINIA SEAVER SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to the students who place first in the Junior Review process in the Interior Design program. Student is selected by the Interior Design committee.

TECHNOLOGY SOLUTIONS SCHOLARSHIP IN COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY

Awarded to Communication Technology majors achieving junior/senior status with a cumulative 2.7 GPA with preference given to Technology Solutions employees.

MARY CULLEN SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to student with a declared major in Communications Technology, cumulative 3.0 GPA or better.

MARY ROSE TAYLOR

Students must be accepted into the Fashion Marketing Innovation program – awarded to students with financial need, with preference given to students who are first-generation and students who are single parents. Must be a full-time student enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours and maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA.

BARTON MALOW

Students must be enrolled Full-Time as an undergraduate student in the Construction Management program who has shown professional promise in the field of building and construction. Preference for the scholarship will be given to a student who has demonstrated need (address in essay).

MANS LUMBER AND MILLWORK

Students must be accepted into the Construction Management program, demonstrate financial need, with a preference given to students that went to a Southeastern Michigan high school (address in essay). Applicants must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours and maintain a cumulative 3.0 GPA.

AISHWARYA REDDY THATIKONDA CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT

Awarded to an International undergraduate or graduate student pursing a major in Construction Management.

BENEDICT AND DOREEN ILOZOR EDUCATION EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to an undergraduate student who is underrepresented in the Construction Management program. Qualified student shall achieve both the highest GPA and the maximum credit completion. Students should include a half-to one page essay detailing life lessons learned form the Construction Management program, what facilitated excellence performance in the classes, recommendations to other upcoming students, and the impacts this scholarship will have. Preference may be given to a student who will contribute to the diversity of the Construction Management program. This award is not for transfer students.
