Hamtramck's First Walk to School Day

Public Health Challenges

- Nationally, children and youth do NOT meet the minimum requirement for physical activity
- MI ranks 5 out of 51 in childhood obesity
 - Asians have a lower obesity rate; however, they are at high risk of developing high blood pressure and diabetes at lower body mass index (BMI)
 - Increasing evidence suggests Asians have higher percent body fat despite lower BMI
- Physical inactivity among South Asian children is HIGH
 - The 2020 Report Card on Support for Walking, Bicycling, and Active Kids and Communities showed that MI is Making Strides (overall score of 120/200)
 - A survey of parents in Hamtramck showed that 45-48% of parents walked or biked to and from school with their children



Setting


- Hamtramck is called Banglatown because of its high concentration of Bangladeshi residents
- The City of Hamtramck has 8 public schools
- 6 out of the 8 public schools in Hamtramck had a student population that was 30-40% Asian



At a Glance

- Eastern Michigan University (EMU) Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) team launched Safe Routes to School (SRTS) to increase walking and bicycling to and from school
- Local partners include the City of Hamtramck, Hamtramck Public School District, and Parent support groups
- Dickinson West (D-West) Elementary was the first school to do a Walk to School Day (W2SD) on March 4, 2020

Results

- Partnered with Hamtramck Public Schools and MI Fitness Foundation to Launch First W2SD on March 4, 2020 at D-West
- 62 students, teachers, staff, firefighters, and police officers walked on two routes to D-West.







Next Steps:

- Host W2SD with two additional elementary schools
- Create parent coalitions to assist in completing walking audits of common routes, serve as crossing guards and walking chaperones
- Support sustainable schools-wide walking programs
