

How are Sociology and Anthropology similar:

Sociology and anthropology involve the study of social life and culture in order to understand the causes and consequences of human action. Sociologists and anthropologists study cultures and modern, industrial societies in both Western and non-Western cultures.

How are Sociology and Anthropology different:

Anthropology largely concentrates on traditional, small, or indigenous cultures. Sociology is interested in societies and large groups of people at all levels of development.

EMU SOCIOLOGY 105 (Introductory Sociology) Course Description:

Basic sociological concepts are used to analyze social systems, socialization, social inequality, deviance and conformity, and the process of social change with focus on family, educational, religious, governmental and economic institutions.

EMU ANTHROPOLOGY 135 (Cultural Anthropology) Course Description:

The study of human adaptations to natural and cultural environments focusing upon a variety of societies. The basic institutions of human society such as kinship, religion, law, politics and economics will be examined.
