Emeritus Professor Dr. Richard Douglass Delivers Powerful Lecture on the U.S. Healthcare System

Dr. Douglass' lecture, "Understanding and Navigating the Work Environment of Healthcare in the U.S. as Health Professionals," was delivered to an audience of students, faculty and alumni in the EMU Student Center on October 25th.

Based on research and insights gleaned during the writing of his book, "The Evolution of the US Healthcare System: A Legacy of Opportunism and Greed," as well as 50 years of experience in the field of healthcare, he discussed the clash of health service workers' good-natured desires for working in this field with the complications that arise within large organizations and corporate structures.

The professional challenges that arise from these conflicts and the systematic failures that allow them to exist were highlighted in the discussion. Dr. Douglass shared his wealth of experience and research with

A lifelong academic, Dr. Douglass has served on the faculties of the University of Michigan, Wayne State University and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control in Chicago. His contributions to EMU include creating an endowed scholarship within the CHHS alongside Emeritus Professor William

Lavery, as well as the students he has inspired with his passion for bettering the healthcare system.

His work extends beyond the U.S., as he helped to create a partnership with Ashesi University in Ghana.

National Institutes of Health (NIH) Organization Awards Grant to Dr. Tsu-Yin Wu to Combat Firearm Violence

In response to the growing public health crisis involving firearm deaths, the NIH issued funding for researching, developing and implementing ways to reduce firearm violence and the ensuing trauma it brings to affected communities. One such grant was awarded to Dr. Tsu-Yin Wu, CHHS faculty member and director of the Center for Health Disparities Innovations and Studies (CHDIS).

The award, Adaptable Community-Engaged Intervention for Violence Prevention: Michigan Model, will be used by Dr. Wu and the CHDIS to identify, create and implement intervention strategies for Asian American communities in Michigan, which have become more at-risk due

to a rise in racism and gun ownership. By identifying common risk and protective factors, they hope to create intervention points to lower the risk of firearm violence.

The CHDIS and Dr. Wu seek to reduce racial and ethnic health disparities of minority populations in Michigan. By working with local leaders to identify the roots of these disparities, their team works to develop services, education opportunities and training tailored to the community. ■

The College of Health & Human Services online registered nursing program to Bachelor of Science in Nursing earned the top spot in Michigan for the 2023 to 2024 school year by EduMed, an organization that guides those interested in pursuing a career in medicine and health. It provides free content and tools to find the best program and career path for every student's circumstances.

Ranked by assigned weighting, EduMed takes into account financial, quality of education and career and academic support when determining a program's position. These include average in-state tuition, financial aid awarded, academic counseling, career placement services, number of online programs and student-to-faculty ratio, among others.

In 2022, Vicki Washington was appointed associate director of online nursing studies, where she has put forth meaningful efforts toward improving the quality,

accessibility and overall experience of the programs. In response to the EMU's ranking, Washington said, "I believe this recognition demonstrates the commitment of the faculty and staff to listen to our students' needs and concerns and go all out to provide the best education possible by meeting the students where they are." ■
