FAMILY & CHILDREN'S SERVICES

MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE RECOVERY

Prepares graduates to work towards the recovery and empowerment of persons coping with mental illness, substance abuse, and co-occurring conditions in the public and non-profit settings.

Prepares graduates in developing skills and expertise for working in collaborative, interdisciplinary health, and aging-related settings.
