HOW TO: AT HOME SELF-TAPE AUDITION

At home? No problem! Successful filming tips!




WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

Cellphone or laptop
Person or tripod
Solid background
Monologue (memorized or printed copy)

LIGHTING

Look around your home or bedroom and see what options you have for a well-lit area. Setting up your camera in-front of a window or on the side of one can provide a good source of light. Make sure you, the actor is opposite the window or lamp. Also recording during the daytime provides natural lighting. You do not want a glare, you just want to ensure that you can be seen. No window? Make sure your lights are on. Avoid using the flashlight on your camera. A ring light also works wonders. We all don't have access to a three-point light setup.



SOLID BACKGROUND



Sometimes the most difficult part is finding a solid wall clear of picture frames or light fixtures. A solid colored wall that you can stand in front of to record works perfectly. These include but not limited to, a white or neutral wall. Even curtains that are a solid color can work well depending on the lighting. Some people even prefer hanging up a neutral colored flat bed-sheet. Remember no distractions or moving objects in the background, no matter how cute your cat is.

DON'T FORGET SOUND

We only want to hear you, which means no background noise. The sound should be clean and free of any distractions. Quiet your housemates, close the door and/or window, turn off the TV, radio, etc. If you have a lavalier mic use it.



READY TO HIT RECORD?

Wipe off/clean your cellphone lens (whether your using your front facing or rear camera). Ensure that your camera is either held by a person with steady hands or Tripod at eye level. Remember to have the phone horizontal to shoot in landscape mode.



Proper Framing

You want a tight frame from your chest to just above the top of your head

Be sure to slate looking directly at the camera. Then place focus slightly off-camera (to the left or right) when performing monologue.

Can you be seen? Can you be heard?

Send in one smooth complete take instead of editing a bunch of takes and finally, follow uploading instructions!
