



King- Chávez -Parks Future Faculty Fellowship

The King-Chávez-Parks (KCP) Future Faculty Fellowship (FFF) is a competitive award offered to graduate and doctoral students with an aim to increase the pool of traditionally underrepresented candidates pursuing careers in postsecondary education; promoting inclusivity and diversity in US colleges and universities. Preference may not be given to applicants on the basis of race, color, ethnicity, gender, or national origin. Applications from minorities, women, people with disabilities, and individuals from cultural, linguistic, geographic, and socio-economic backgrounds who would otherwise not be adequately represented in the graduate student and faculty populations are encouraged to apply.

The KCP Future Faculty Fellowship Award provides a maximum of up to \$20,000 for master's level Fellows, and for doctoral Fellows up to \$35,000.

The King- Chávez -Parks (KCP) Future Faculty Fellowship Program (FFF) of Eastern Michigan University is funded by the State of Michigan's Workforce Development Agency and administered through the Graduate School.

ELIGIBILITY

Required eligibility criteria:

- U.S. citizenship
- Michigan resident
- Currently enrolled in a master's or a doctoral program at Eastern Michigan University
- Enrolled in a degree program which facilitates a post-secondary career

Service/Loan Repayment:

Future Faculty Fellowship graduates are obligated, by signed agreement, to complete postsecondary faculty teaching or administration. This activity can be done concurrent with graduate studies or upon completion of their degree.

APPLICATION AND DEADLINES:

The Application deadline for the next KCP FFF Fellowship is November 1, 2016. The number of awards is contingent on state funding. The 2018 KCP Fellowship Application will be available April 1, 2017. Fellowships begin in winter semesters.
