The committee meetings and the regular meeting, which were live streamed and available to the public, were held in part at Welch Hall and in part remotely due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Eastern Michigan University commits additional \$3.5 million in student financial aid for fall 2021 to support student success; total financial aid budget of \$54.8 million represents 156% increase over the last 14 years (includes general fund, auxiliary fund budget approvals)

Eastern Michigan University seeks to boost more four-year graduations, incentivizes taking more credits through block tuition pricing model; under the plan, students will pay the same price for 16 credits as they will for 12

Board of Regents approves \$4.6 million capital project for new 3D Arts Complex
