

Updated information about COVID-19 vaccines *emailed April 23, 2021*

To students, faculty and staff:

Many EMU students, faculty, and staff have already been fully vaccinated. Thank you!

As the semester comes to a close, the University strongly encourages every member of the campus community to receive a COVID-19 vaccine as soon as you are eligible. Everyone 16 years of age or older is now eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine in Michigan.

Here is the latest information about your opportunity to receive a free COVID-19 vaccine.

Washtenaw County Health Department

Individuals who live or work in Washtenaw County are eligible for vaccination by the Washtenaw County Health Department (WCHD). Currently, all available vaccines are “two-dose” vaccines, which means that 3-4 weeks after you receive your first dose, you must be available to receive a second dose **in the same location** you received your first dose. What happens after you're fully vaccinated?

People are considered fully vaccinated:

- 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

Many people have questions about what they can and cannot do after being fully vaccinated. **You must continue to wear a mask on EMU's campus consistent with the [University's policy](#) even if you have been fully vaccinated.** [Please click here](#) to review the CDC recommendations about what you should keep doing, along with what you can start to do, after you are fully vaccinated on topics such as travel, isolation/quarantine, testing and more.
