

# ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

## ESL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### ESL CONDITIONAL ADMISSION

#### Undergraduate (UG) students with:

- TOEFL score of 499 (PBT), 60 (iBT), or lower
- MELAB score of 71 or lower
- IELTS score of 5.5 or lower
- PTE score of 43 or lower

#### Graduate (GR) students with:

- TOEFL score of 549 (PBT), 78 (iBT), or lower
- MELAB score of 76 or lower
- IELTS score of 6.0 or lower
- PTE score of 52 or lower
- sub-score (if required) below the minimum required by the program

Students take the required ESL courses. ESL credits may be applied to a student's degree program for graduation, pending advisor's approval.

For admissions: contact International Admissions and complete a degree-seeking application.

Students proceed directly to their degree program after finishing required ESL courses.

### FULL ADMISSION

#### Undergraduate (UG) students with:

- TOEFL score of 500 (PBT) 61 (iBT), or higher a
- MELAB score of 72 or higher
- IELTS score of 6.0 or higher
- PTE score of 44 or higher

#### Graduate (GR) students with:

- TOEFL score of 550 (PBT), 79 (iBT), or higher
- MELAB score of 77 or higher
- IELTS score of 6.5 or higher
- PTE score of 53 or higher

(Some graduate programs require higher scores or specific sub-scores.)

Students are not required to take ESL courses, but may choose to take ESL courses. ESL credits may be applied to a student's degree program for graduation, pending advisor's approval.

For admission: contact the Office of International Admissions and complete a degree-seeking application

### INTENSIVE ENGLISH ADMISSION

No TOEFL, IELTS, MELAB, or PTE score is required.

Students take only ESL courses. Intensive ESL courses may not be applied to a student's degree program.

For admissions: contact the ESL Program and complete an IEP application.

Completion of the Intensive English program does not guarantee admission to a degree program. However, while studying in the Intensive English program, students may apply for degree admission.

### ARRIVAL

All students taking ESL classes **MUST** arrive several days before each semester to:

- Attend the required International Student Orientation
- Take the ESL placement test
- Register for classes

### PLACEMENT

All ESL students (IEP & Conditional Admission) take the ESL placement test on EMU campus to determine levels.

### ESL ADVANCEMENT

Once students are enrolled in ESL courses, they must complete the sequence of ESL courses, or test out of the ESL program completely (by submitting a new TOEFL/IELTS/MELAB/PTE score). Once enrolled in ESL courses, students may not submit new sub scores to skip levels or test out of individual courses.

Students must complete core classes writing, reading and speaking/listening with a grade of B or higher **AND** must place into the score range on the ESL placement test to advance to the next level.

Students are required to complete core classes to advance to the next level. Students who do not complete one or more core classes in a level will take restricted elective classes along with core classes until they successfully complete core classes.

ESL conditionally-admitted students may or may not be eligible to take other EMU courses at the same time as ESL classes, depending on their ESL placement.

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## ESL CURRICULUM AND COURSES

### ESL ONLY — REQUIREMENTS

#### 18 hours per week required

- Students with IEP admission.
- Students with conditional admission who test into levels 0-300.

### ESL/ACADEMIC — REQUIREMENTS

#### 9-12 hours per week required pending placement

- Students must be conditionally admitted to a degree program
- Students with conditional admission who test into levels 400 and 500
