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Google Docs/Form to Save the Day

- Standard Questions in a Google Doc/Form
- Breakout rooms randomly assigned with 3-4 participants
- 15-minute window to discuss questions and enter responses
- Everyone came back together
- Each group elected a leader to discuss responses and rationale
- Groups explored commonalities and opportunities for growth
- Students entered second session to create a communication document on same Vsim patient
- Cycle repeated

Questions Responses 7

Describe the components of a focused cardiac assessment?

7 responses

- inspect and palpate skin of thorax, auscultate heart and lung sounds. Feel for capillary refills, check for jugular vein distension. Pain assessment and pulse ox. Check for bruits on corated artery.
- Listen to heart sounds, help capillary refill times, observe and palpate skin, vital signs, ask about any chest pain, check neck for any distention, check peripheral pulses
- Inpsect/palpate skin of thorax and extremities, auscultate heart and lung sounds, check capillary refill uppere and lower extremities, check peripheral pulses on each extremity, check for jugular vein distension, pain assessment, pulse oximetry, check for bruits on carotid if deemed necessary
- auscultate the heart, assessing capillary refill, BP, heart rate, auscultate to lung sounds, assessing and palpating hands, legs, and feet, checking strength and equality of pulses, assess the neck and jugular veins, assess the mouth and lips, and EKG if abnormality is found.
- Inspect the mouth, inspect the nose, inspect the neck, inspect his nails for capillary refill, inspect the lungs, check radial and tibial pulse, check all spots of heart and lungs for sounds and rhythm.

We did this in lecture.

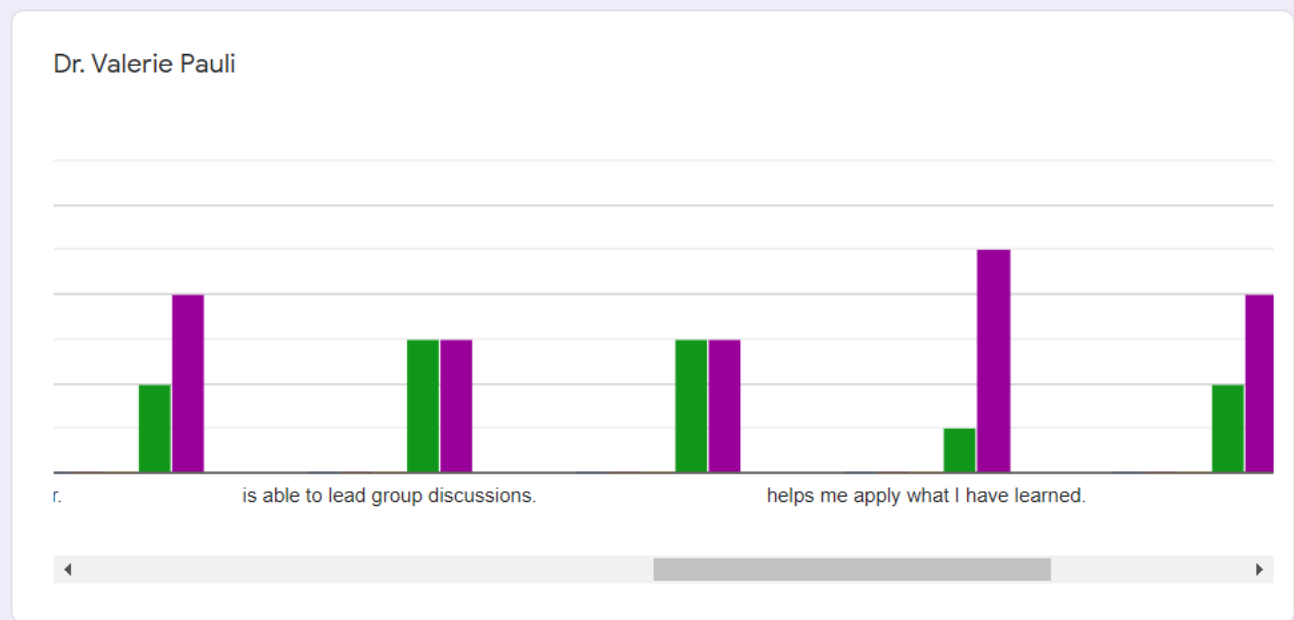
CC is he "feels his heart is skipping beats". Jared is a 1 day post-operative full knee replacement
