- Preventing circumstances where students with marginalized identities perform emotional labor to educate their privileged peers



- Our lived experiences are invalidated / ignored in a class
- Issues that matter to us are not addressed in a sensitive manner
- Not feeling safe/seen/included in a class

Strategies for Faculty

- Set expectations about classroom culture
- Writing exercises during/after a challenging conversation
- Model cultural humility
- Micro-interventions for calling in and calling out

Strategies for Students

- Listen respectfully; be open to perspectives different from yours
- Commit to learning not debating
- Report problematic behaviors (department chair, college ombuds, etc.)

General Strategies

- Speak from personal experience
- Acknowledge when you do not know/understand something
- Empathetic engagement
- Psychological safety is required for authentic conversations
- Embrace and make room for emotions
