- III. **Guest Presentation: Age-Friendly University** 3:10 pm
 - Andrea Zakrajsek, Program Director for the Aging Studies Program
 - Age Friendly University Initiative. International effort. About 1200 students age 40 years and over. Needs for older adults in our community. Relevant to students and community. Ten principles for an age friendly university, identified in the **handout**. EMU would commit to work towards them. No cost. Will Senate endorse EMU participation in this initiative? Six universities have endorsed this nationwide. We would be the first in Michigan. It would mean a presence on EMU website. **Motion: Senate supports EMU participation in Age Friendly University Initiative.** Motion passed unanimously.

- Election of Senate President – went out yesterday via email. Election period April 6-13. Fully confidential.
 - Athletics Program Cut and Parking Concessions – Coalition on campus to push back on cuts. Athletes are pushing back against cuts the hardest. They are bringing powerful folks together to work with them. All appreciate the disrespect reflected in the absence of input. Looks like actual savings are closer to \$400K and the \$2.4 million the administration suggested. Students are sitting in at Welch. Students are planning a walk out. Forty thousand people signed a petition to save wrestling. High school coaches are excluding their athletes from contact with EMU coaches.
