

Consumer Information

This page contains information on the institution, financial assistance, scholarship fraud, graduation rates, campus security, student rights and responsibilities, athletic participation and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act at Eastern Michigan University.

In accordance with federal regulations set forth by The Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, this guide contains a summary of consumer information that must be made available to all students at EMU. Information about the Institution

Costs of Attending the Institution

Many resources are available detailing the costs of attending EMU. Refund Policy

The university has a tuition refund policy that stipulates the amount of tuition and fees that are refunded to a student who withdraws from all classes during a term. Visit the [Registrar's site](#) for information about refunds.

Requirements for Withdrawal

Students who are withdrawing from all classes at the University must notify the Registrar's Office by following specific [withdrawal procedures](#) posted in the Student Guide.

Return of Federal Financial Aid

The federal government mandates that students who withdraw from all classes may only keep the financial aid (federal Title IV grant and loan assistance) they have "earned" up to the time of withdrawal. Funds that were disbursed in excess of the earned amount must be returned by the university to the federal government. Graduation and Retention Rates

Eastern Michigan University's graduation rate after six years for the fall 2010 cohort class is 40.72%. This is the rate of degree seeking full-time undergraduate students who have graduated from their programs within 150% of the normal time for graduation.

Eastern Michigan University's full-time student retention rate from fall 2015 to fall 2016 was 74.63% for first time undergrads and 76.19% for transfer students.

Athletic Program Participation and Financial Support

The Equity in Athletics Data Analysis Cutting Tool was designed to provide access to public inquiries relating to the Equity in Athletics Data. The data is drawn from the Office of Postsecondary Education of the U.S. Department of Education (OPE) Equity in Athletics Disclosure Website database, which is an online database that consists of athletics data that are submitted annually. This is required by the Equity in Athletics Disclosure Act (EADA), via a Web-based data collection, by all co-educational postsecondary institutions that receive Title IV funding (i.e., those that participate in federal student aid programs) and that have an intercollegiate athletics program.

Campus Safety and Security

EMU Department of Public Safety (DPS) patrols the campus area, in addition to the SEEUS walking escort service to guide student's safety at night.

The EMU Police Department is a fully functioning, professional police department with full law enforcement capabilities. The Police Department is located at 1200 Oakwood Street and is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to serve the needs of the campus community. The department is comprised of seven sergeants, thirty sworn police officers, and eight dispatchers.

All of our police officers are certified through the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES). As sworn officers, they are empowered to investigate crimes and make arrests or take other necessary action to address any criminal or other public infractions in the vicinity of the EMU campus. EMU police officers work closely with all area police agencies, including the Ypsilanti Police Department, Michigan State Police and Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department.

The Eastern Michigan University Police Department prepares an Annual Security Report to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act.

This report is prepared in cooperation with the Housing and Student Judicial Services Departments. Each entity provides updated information on their educational efforts and programs to comply with the Act.
