Thursday, September 22: Introduction to SPSS, Part 1 with Grigoris Argeros

A "hands-on" workshop is for faculty and graduate students who have never used or need to be updated with the statistics package SPSS. The menu-driven Windows version of SPSS will be demonstrated for performing common tasks such as: entering data into SPSS, creating variable and value labels, computing new variables, recording values, running selected statistical procedures, and saving data and output files. The SPSS I Workshop will cover all the basics. (Intended for Faculty and Graduate Students)

Thursday, September 29: Introduction to SPSS, Part 2 with Grigoris Argeros

A "hands-on" workshop for faculty and graduate students who want to know how to create and use syntax files for SPSS for Windows. The SPSS II Workshop will cover selected advanced features and syntax files. Syntax files are text files allowing the user to run programs on a SPSS data file. The advantages of using syntax files rather than menu-driven systems will be discussed and demonstrated during the workshop. (Intended for Faculty and Graduate Students)

Friday, October 7: Grant Basics: the "101" of How ORDA Can Help with Dr. Erica Goff

This workshop will provide an overview of the grant process, such as how to find, apply for, and write grants. Also addressed will be how the Office of Research Development and Administration can provide support in this process. (Intended for Faculty and Graduate Students)

Tuesday, October 18: I Don't Know What I Don't Know: Q&A with ORDA Department
